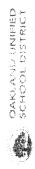

V. Title I

1. Fall Revisions

Maya Taylor: Last meeting, we spoke about Title I Fall Revisions (\$17,352.00 we received due to being 30 scholars over projected enrollment) and what we were thinking of spending those monies on. But based on the budget one pagers Principals received for next year and due to the low projected enrollment, sites are being allowed to carry over Title I, Title IV and Measure G1 funds. I propose holding the Title I Fall Revision monies (\$17,352.00), as well as Title IV monies as 20-21 carryover funding to address the potential shortfalls we are facing in 20-21. If it is ok with SSC, we can hold these Title I & Title IV Fall Revision monies as carryover funds for next year. Thoughts/concerns/questions?

Hakeem Bey: I would not want Westlake to lose these this money. I am ok with this as long as someone is making sure that money does get carried over and not absorbed into the district budget.

Maya Taylor: If they come back and say we aren't holding over, I will contact SSC.

Malika Rubin-Davis: I attended the recent Board Meeting and that seems logical since the Board said that Westlake was going to lose one FTE at the AP position and will add a classified administrator. The Board also said they would be taking \$1.4 million out of the reserves to offset these cuts to make sure schools run as smoothly as possible.

Maya Taylor: That is correct that we are losing the AP FTE based on cohort numbers and projected enrollment. For the 19/20 school year we were projected at ~252 scholars but on the 20 day count we had ~284 scholars (32 more); for the 20/21 school year, we are projected at 32 less scholars, which is one less FTE.

Maya Taylor: We receive funding through Salesforce for Blueprint Math. Malika Rubin-Davis: Similar to teaching artists, maybe there could be interns to push in to classes for supports. Push-ins are happening with Citizen Schools after school staff. Questioning Dynamic Mindfulness. Maya Taylor: I am questioning the effectiveness of Dynamic Mindfulness to. When I was teaching in a classroom, it is just the reading of an article. Scholars were not tuning in and acting too cool for school. There is a choice in participation and I am not quite sure how many of our scholars are grasping it. Morgan Cohen: I feel that we have not received adequate training across the board and there seems to be so much going on to not have adequate training. I have tried it as well and gotten the same response from the kids as you Ms. Taylor. Because of the training issue, we haven't really given it a fair shot. If it continues, it should be mandatory and requires building rapport with the kids, Maya Taylor: I believe it was presented to teachers as an option as we didn't have the manpower to roll it out school wide,

Morgan Cohen: If there were more training, it was made mandatory to participate and routine in class – it may be more effective.

Malika Rubin-Davis: Believe it would be successful with more training, clear expectations and consistence among Westlake staff.

Maya Taylor: I have seen it implemented and successful at Frick. It has become the mindset of their students and a part of their relationships. Ideal Franklin: There is a dedicated staff person to the Mindfulness Program at Frick.

Morgan Cohen: It would be good to check in with staff and get their input as well.

Maurice Andre San-Chez: I feel like I need to be more confident in it to teach it.

Maya Taylor: Mr. Gutierrez had our DM Coach teach it to him and he taught it back to get comfortable with it. Teachers can schedule one on ones with her. Malika Rubin-Davis: Maybe a staff meetings, DM practices can be a regular expectation

Maya Taylor: We will keep Dynamic Mindfulness for now in G1 and give it more consideration/discussion at the next meeting.

Title I Engagement

Maya Taylor: With the proposed cuts for next year and how it will impact our scholars, I am proposing to use 20-21 Title I Funds for an additional case manager and any other support needs. This will support our new vision for the Wellness Room, formerly the SOAR Center. An additional case manager will be able to support teachers in classroom climate and culture, as well as

Ideal Franklin: Only 5 players attended the game and 3 of them are ineligible due to grades. The coach forfeited and left the game not allowing the other team the opportunity to play. We can forfeit due to ineligibility but we are not supposed to walk out. What should have happened is the game was forfeited due to ineligibility but the game is still played as a scrimmage. I received calls from the Commissioner as this was the first game I was not at as the Athletic Director. It has been addressed with the coach and I have apologized on his behalf and do not anticipate it happening again.

Maurice Andre San-Chez: Also unrelated to SSC, I have an Donors Choose fundraising request coming up soon for microphones for the Arts Department and performances that ar about \$14,000.

Malika Rubin-Davis: We also have a letter writing campaign to Tyler Perry and Ms. Taylor will be sending those off.

Morgan Cohen: How are rehearsals going for "The Wiz?"

Maurice Andre San-Chez: The core group is great.

Hakeem Bey: Let me know when it is up and running and I will take it around to some places.

Maurice Andre San-Chez: "The Wiz" performance in scheduled for the beginning of May.

Malika Rubin-Davis: In the process of making the flyer and will send it out when it is completed.

Maya Taylor: The admin team is also hosting a college tour during Spring Break 3/30-4/2.

Hakeem Bey: Has there been a lot of kids interested?

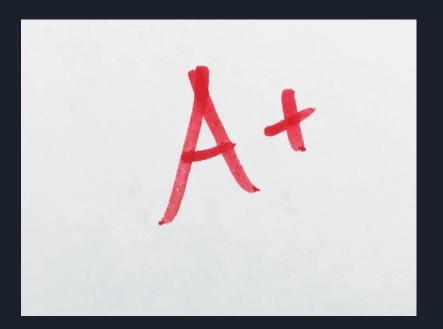

Westlake will have a Visual Art, Theatre(Drama), and Choir & Dance program for the 2019/2020 school year. Measure G1 funds will be used to retain and increase the FTE of the Drama Teacher from .8 FTE to 1.0 FTE and the Choir & Dance Teacher from .6 FTE to 1.0 FTE (.4 FTE of the Choir & Dance Teacher will be paid by site funding) to allow for more scholars to participate in these electives

Our Drama Teacher is in place and is averaging 10-12 scholars per section participating in Drama this school year. A success of the Drama Program is our 6th Grade Elective Wheel that allows all 6th Grade Scholars to take one marking period of Drama in an effort to increase/grow the program for next school year. Another success this year was our Winter FAN (Fine Arts Night) where drama scholars performed original skits written and directed by their peers. The topics chosen were those that are relevant to the experience of young people today (bullying, trying to fit in with peers and there was even a fairytale with a teenage spin to it). Our Drama Teacher is also now 1.0 FTE allowing for more variation in the classes that are offered (i.e. Beginning Drama and Advanced Drama).

Some of the challenges that we have encountered is the addition of one other elective, BluePrint Math, that scholars are enrolled in to receive Math support. This has decreased the number of scholars that are enrolled in our traditional electives.

Our Choir Teacher is in place and averaging 10-12 scholars per section. A success of the Choir Program is also the 6th Grade Elective Wheel. Another success was our Winter FAN in which the choir performed alongside our music department. Most recently, our choir has been invited to participate in the OUSD Orchestra Festival this Spring.

A challenge this year for the Dance Program has been credentialing. Our Choir teacher was also our Dance Teacher but due to credentialing was not able to teach our dance class this academic year.

Our Drama and Choir Teachers are currently working on a production of "The Wiz" for the Spring Semester.

We have partnered with the Niroga Mindfulness Institute for school-wide implementation of our Mindfulness Practices for both scholars and staff. We have a Culture Keeper from Niroga Institute that is working with 4 classrooms (scholars), 2 individual teachers and recently began running Mindfulness Groups with 7 boys and 7 girls (bi-weekly) to support in the regulation of their emotions and providing them with tools for coping with stressful situations. The Culture Keeper is working with 2 individual teachers that are learning the practice for themselves to be able to lead the exercises in their classrooms and be teacher leaders for staff.
