Dear Special Education Families and Community,

We--the parents, students, staff, and community members of the Community Advisory Committee for Special Education—want to connect with you, our Special Education community. We want to express our support and solidarity during this eighth week of sheltering in place. We know from first-hand experience the additional challenges that you face and how difficult it can be to get the right information and assistance. We will do whatever we can to promote clarity and transparency even as circumstances continue to change.

It is important that families know that:

- IEP meetings and processes continue to happen during Covid-19;
- accommodations must be implemented to make sure that students have access to learning;
- Special Education instruction and services continue to the extent that it is safe and feasible during the pandemic;

In essence, students continue to have access to a Free and Appropriate Public Education consistent with their IEPs.

With that, please consider this statement from the US Department of Education as you seek support for your child:

"It is important to emphasize that federal disability law allows for flexibility in determining how to meet the individual needs of students with disabilities. The determination of how FAPE is to be provided may need to be different in this time of unprecedented national emergency. As mentioned above, FAPE may be provided consistent with the need to protect the health and safety of students with disabilities and those individuals providing special education and related services to students."
