

OUSD/Oakland Ed Fund COVID-19 Relief Fund:

- Raised \$1,552,600 to support meal program, distance learning, and direct assistance to families. The Ed Fund is distributing at least \$600,000 directly to 1,500 hundred families.
- We launched phase 2 to raise an additional \$2.5M, of which \$1M will be to continue direct assistance to families.
