Facilities Committee June 12, 2020

- Approve a refined bond project list that includes less than \$1 billion in estimated cost
- 2. Discuss the process for analyzing community input on the refined bond project list
- Approve forwarding the draft bond measure to the Board of Education for consideration and vote.





Understanding Different Documents

Facilities Master Plan:

 Identifies need through entire District, includes estimated costs, and does not include construction timeline or order

Bond Measure:

Includes list of projects, does not include cost, and does not include construction timeline or order

Spending Plan:

 Includes list of projects, includes estimated costs, and includes basic construction timeline or order





Voter Surveys

- FM3 conducted surveys in January and May 2020
 - Second survey was necessary in light of COVID
- May survey:
 - Support among City's major demographics is above 55%
 - Support is durable in the face of pro and con messaging
 - Voters display little tax sensitivity
 - \$735 million bond measure appears viable for Nov 2020





Voter Surveys

- May survey findings regarding specific projects:
 - Highest priority investments to relate to basic repairs
 - Also support distance learning, career technical education, early childhood education, affordable housing for students and staff
 - Voters resonated
 - Bond will invest in basic repairs
 - Repurpose unused school site for administrative use to stop paying rent at 1000 Broadway
 - Better support students in response to the COVID-19 pandemic
 - Accountability requirements







Voter Surveys

- May survey findings regarding specific projects:
 - Voter concerns
 - Perceived history of misuse of funds
 - City's high cost of living
 - Plans for administration building (with no mention of rent at 1000 Broadway)
 - However, support still remains above threshold for passage
 - Administrative building does not significantly reduce support if unused school site is repurposed and used to stop paying rent at 1000 Broadway





Bond Project List Components

- Specific Named Projects
 - To be discussed later
- District Wide Projects
 - Draft language is found in Exhibit B of Attachment B
- Additional language allowing District to adjust to changing needs of projects
 - E.g., inflation to the discovery of asbestos to earthquakes





Bond Project List Challenge

Total Need: \$3.4 billion

- Propose Bond Amount: \$735 million
- Only represents approximately <u>one-fifth</u> of need





Bond Project List Buckets

- Greatest Health/Safety Needs:
 - Most in need of health/safety improvements
- Previously Approved Projects:
 - Projects previously approved by Board but not completed
- **Strategic Initiatives:**
 - Best enable District facilities to serve future students
- **Districtwide Improvements:**
 - Similar improvements needed by all school sites





Bond Project List Buckets

- Data and Considerations
 - Facilities Conditions Index (FCI) Ranking
 - Regional distribution
 - Project type distribution
 - Future growth and/or demand
 - Need to generate demand
 - Other projects funded at sites through Measures B and J
 - Projects not completed





Bond Project List Buckets

10% for Contingency	\$73.5 million
Bond Program Management	\$56.0 million
Districtwide Improvements	\$250.0 million
Strategic Initiatives	\$251.7 million
Previously Approved Projects	\$238.3 million
Greatest Health/Safety Needs	\$245.4 million





- Approve a refined bond project list that includes less than \$1 billion in estimated cost
 - Reduce estimated cost in each bucket to approx. \$200 million
 - Can narrow scope of project or eliminating project
 - New projects will necessitate reducing costs even further
