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### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

A new modern classroom building has been completed at Glenview Elementary. The new building replaces the old classroom building and relocatables. The new classroom building features:

Existing main entry and accompanying façade. New accessible (ADA) ramps provide accessibility from street level to the main entry doorway. Replacement of 21 classrooms, library, cafeteria, multipurpose room, stage and administrative offices.

#### **CONSTRUCTION UPDATE:**

- Finalizing commissioning, and final testing of systems nearly complete.
- Network work is complete, internet access and Wi-Fi are functional.
- Lower yard work is in progress, this includes turf replacement, overkote, and new play matting.
- Asphalt work at the street required by City is complete.
- Fencing and handrail work expected to be complete week of 8/3.
- Staff underway week of 7/27, unpacking classroom materials.
- Most furniture has been delivered, issues with missing parts from vendor at some classrooms and offices.
- Alarm testing scheduled for 8/6-8/8, with final testing scheduled for 8/20-8/22. Elevator state inspection to follow (elevator will be unavailable until state inspection).
- Interior punchlist work is nearly complete, exterior is pending.
