High School Distance Learning Scholarship Award Oakland Unified School District

August 10, 2020 Concept Paper

Situation: Anecdotal evidence indicates that the number of high school students

meaningfully participating in distance-learning classes significantly dropped during the ten-week period following the COVID-19 Shelter-In-Place Order. While necessary to protect the public's health, the continuation of distance-learning classes for the 2020 Fall Semester elevates the risk that an

extraordinary number of high school students will become off-track or further

off-track for graduation and satisfactory A-G course completion.

Purpose: To maximize the number of high school students who regularly participate in

distance-learning classes and pass all assigned courses with a "C" grade or better by incentivizing student participation and study under Shelter-In-Place

learning/living conditions.

Target: Every OUSD high school student enrolled at:

Coliseum College Preparatory Academy (2019-2020 = 281/94.7% F&RPM)

Dewey Academy (2019-2020 = 207/89.4% F&RPM) Fremont High School (2019-2020 = 841/91% F&RPM) Life Academy (2019-2020 = 247/91.4% F&RPM)

Madison Park Academy (2019-2020 = 441/93.8% F&RPM) McClymonds High School (2019-2020 = 359/90.3% F&RPM)

Oakland High School (2019-2020 = 1,657/86.4% F&RPM)
Oakland International (2019-2020 = 391/90% F&RPM)

Program: Award a \$1,000 scholarship (or \$500 per quarter/mini-semester) to each high

school student who maintains satisfactory attendance in all distance-learning classes and passes all distance-learning classes with a "C" grade or better.
