Linked Learning Highlight: Oakland High

- Students are working in small groups to research an area that represents a major category of calls that police currently respond to including: mental health crises, homelessness, traffic/vehicles, gender violence, nuisances, violent crime, or drugs/alcohol.
- Based on secondary research and community survey results, students will make a proposal to the Oakland City Council's Reimagining Public Safety Task Force for how the city should reinvest money from OPD to better address this area of need in the community (i.e. through funding an alternative crisis response model or programs, services, or other community investments.)







Linked Learning Highlight: Castlemont HS

- Students extended their spring internships into the summer in order to constructively respond to the COVID-19 pandemic disproportionately impacting East Oakland.
- Projects focused on one of four areas:
 - Design & Fabricate Handwashing Stations: Students engaged with local community organizations that distribute food and water to Bay Area houseless encampments to design, prototype and fabricate easily assembled mobile handwashing stations.
 - Digital Design for Community Partners: The 100 Planters Project goal is to beautify their RV
 Park with design and planting needs as identified by the residents.
 - Food As Medicine: fresh ingredients from the Castlemont Farm were used to prepare healthy meals, that students then documented and used as a form of reflection and connection to their own historical community practices.








Attendance Update - As of 09/30/2020

Percent of Instructional Days Present and Absent




