Three independently researched studies concluded that the lower percentage of Students with IEPs served by charter schools resulted in OUSD district schools serving a higher number of Students
Adopt language as follows: The State of California shall require that applications for new or renewing charter schools include an explicit plan for employing or contracting staff with Moderate/Severe Teaching Credentials.	with IEPs. Without staff prepared to educate students with Moderate/Severe disabilities, a school or group of schools cannot provide a full spectrum of services to students with disabilities.
Adopt language as follows: The State of California shall add to Education Code Section 56030.5 a definition of "intensive" services, indicating that this requires a specialized setting over at least 51% of the school day, and also that named disabilities not requiring such services do not render a student "severely disabled."	California Education Code Section 56030.5 refers to both categories of disability and level of need, and also refers to another section (56800 et seq) which has been removed from current law. Discussions of service and responsibility across school settings need to reference a common understanding of intensive services and severe disability.
Adopt language as follows: In all budgets going forward, the Federal Government shall fully fund 40% of the cost of IDEA.	While Congress has approved 40% as the Federal funding standard for IDEA, the actual funding has come in at 18% or less annually.
