The three continuing Board members and the four Board members-elect held initial orientation sessions:

- On November 20 and 21 (focused on Building Relationships, Meeting Senior Leaders, Understanding Current Strategic Work, and Board Member-Staff Communication and Working Together Effectively);
- On December 11 (focused on governance, the legislative process, and how to get done what Board member wants to get done); and
- On January 22 (focused on the structure of the budget development cycle, the role of the Board and other stakeholders as well as the Alameda County Office of Education, and OUSD's persistent budget challenges and budget management practices).

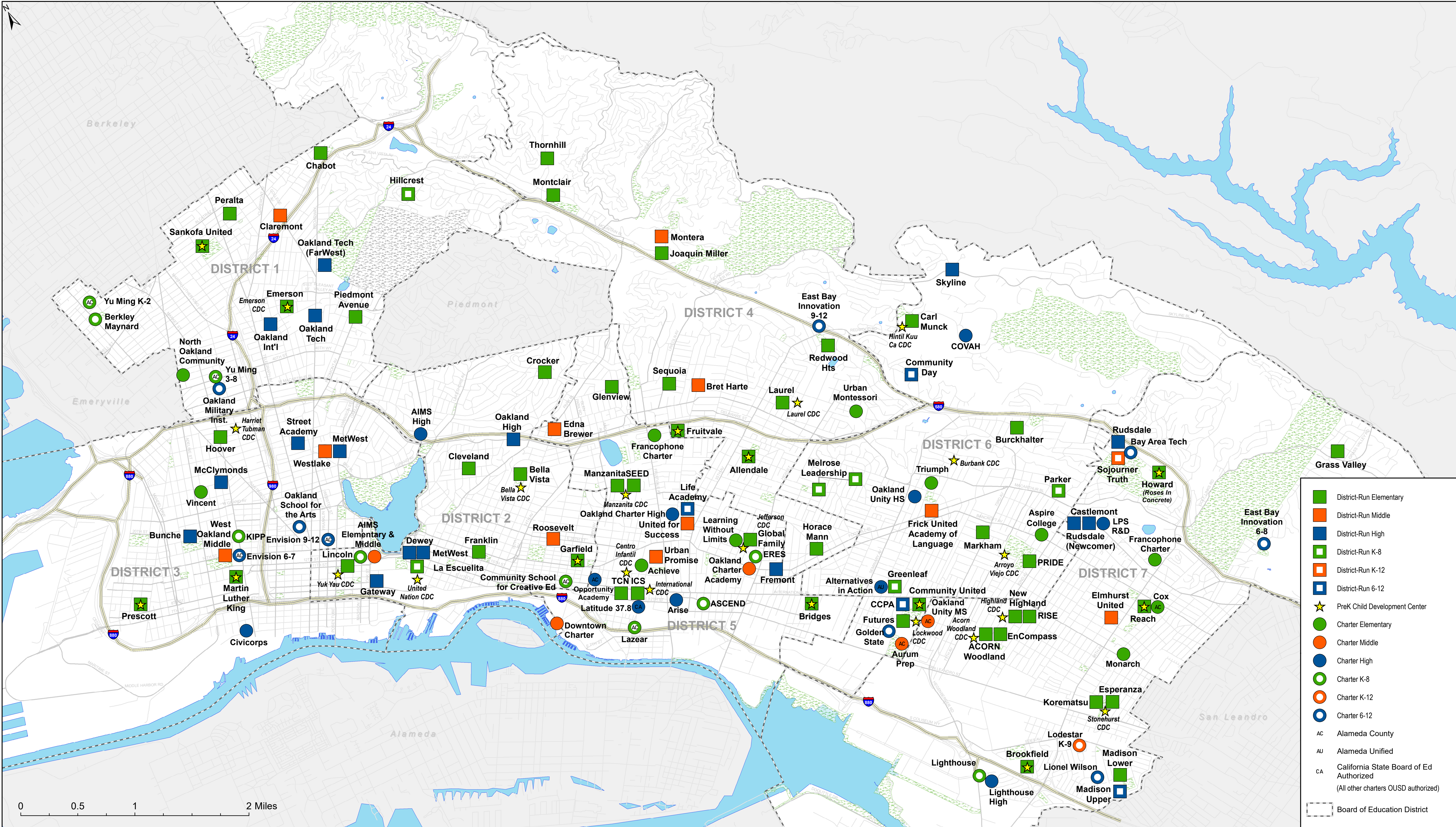

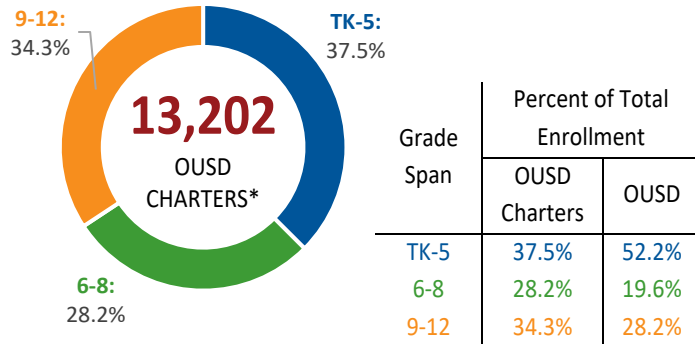

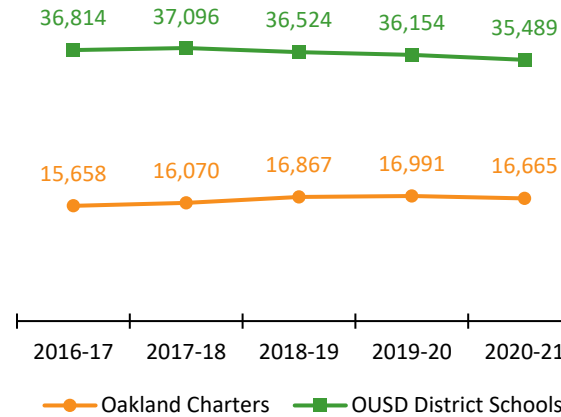

ENROLLMENT BY GRADE SPAN (2020-21)



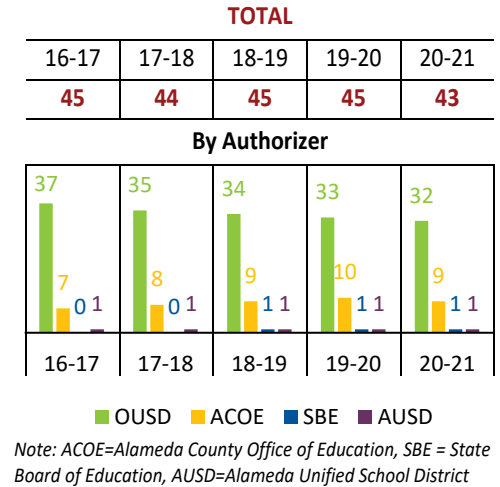

ENROLLMENT BY SCHOOL TYPE

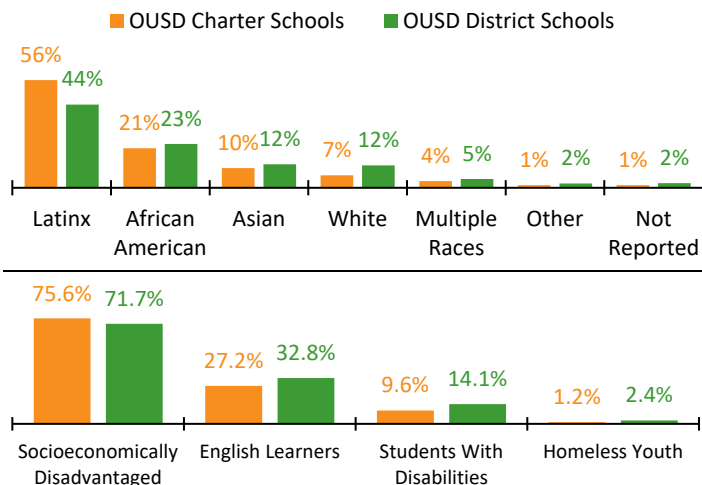

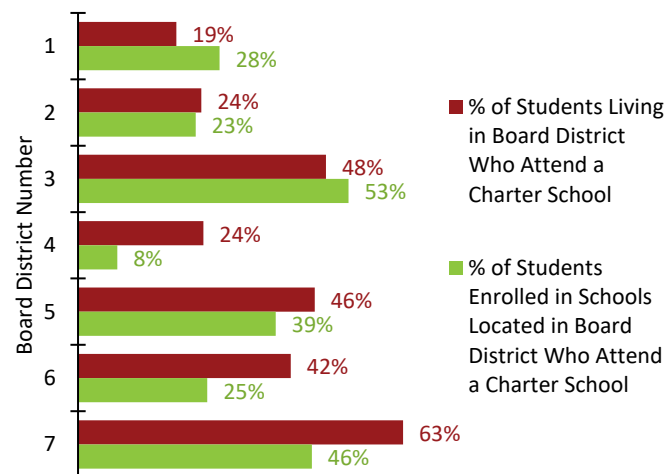

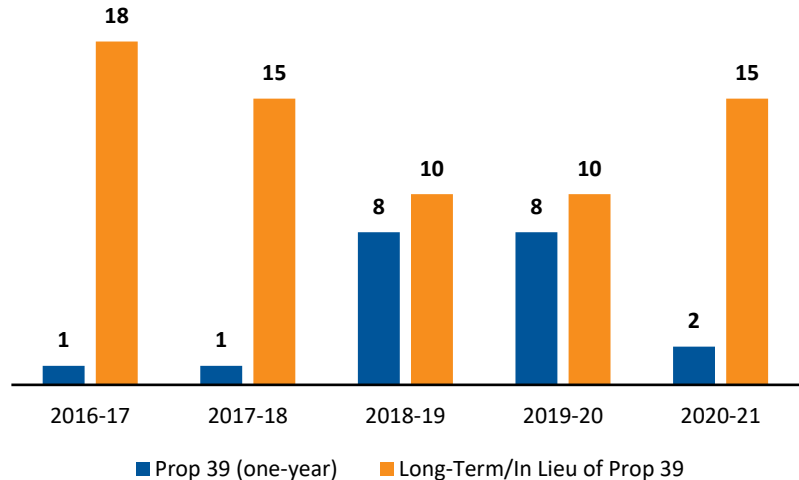

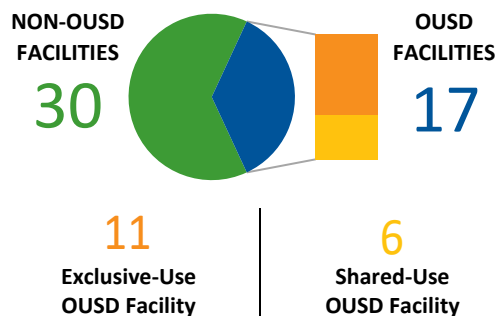

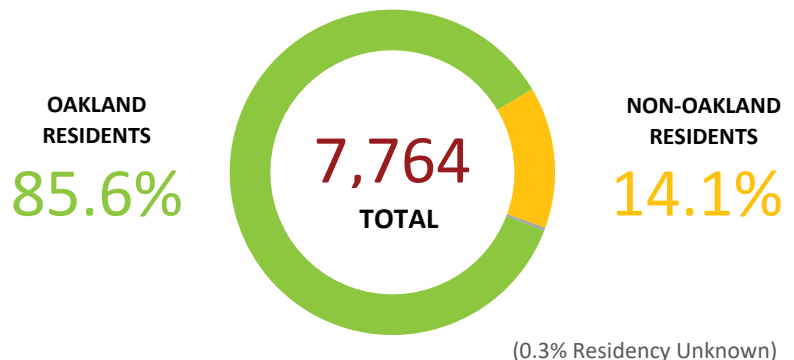
