A question was asked about who the consultant would be. Mr Marik noted it was Patricia Clark.

Mr. Liuzzi asked about the 90k allocation for a salary. It was explained that it includes salary and benefits.

A question was asked whether the pathway coordinator would be 1 day a week but it was explained that it would be a full time job.

### 20-21 Budget Overview

Mr. Marik shared goals for the 21-22 Budget.

Comments:

- Adding a MH counselor will be important. It would be great to keep our interim MH counselor so that we can support our students coming out of a pandemic.
- Adding a general interventionist to support students given the number of Tier <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> students.
- Question was asked on parameters on what we can spend on.
- It was explained that enrollment and other funding impact on what we can spend.
- There was an agreement of adding a MH counselor in order to support the students.



- Support expressed for MH by Cara. Also if possible adding another teacher.
- Hiring a new person to go into new spaced may not be effective given the time needed to build trust.
- Hiring more folks would free up time to do intervention.
- Ms O asked if enrollment allows for the suggestions of freeing up teachers to do intervention.
- It would be a good idea to offer more options for student courses. So if we could free folks to teach other things would be helpful.
- Ms. Fraioli noted the importance of having another MH counselor. Also added to Ms. O about having more teachers to allow more choice for students.
- Adding an 8th grade history class as a foundation to a lot of things. Importance of having a US History course.
- Mr. Lundie noted that extra curriculars are important. Helps build buy in. Also building improvement correlates to higher achievement.
- Ms. G noted elective choice has been hard given schedule constraints.

Mr Marik asked for input from members who hadnt yet shared.

- Estefany noted the importance of having a MH counselor given the issues they may deal with outside and inside of school.
- Chris (student) noted he is supportive of MH counseling but also thinks funding more extracurricular activities and field trips would be good.
