CSCE unfortunately closed its physical doors on 3/13/2020, with the heightening pandemic.

While education continued without interruption, the mode of delivery changed. With these changes came the

shift in demands of our teachers. Given these, we were not able to fill the World Language Spanish position.

We were fortunate that the art teacher position could be filled though reallocation of our ASES funds

thanks to the willingness of our lead agency Attitudinal Healing to redirect their capacity to offer art during

the school day. Neither the challenge, nor this offering were anticipated at the time of our August 20 2020 Amended G1 2020-21 Proposal.

Thanks to the Commission's Dec 2020 approval of our 2019 carry over, we were able in Spring 2021 to pilot our IA support in middle school offered by one high-capacity and beloved IA and PE teacher.

We ask that the Commission now consider allowing us to merge new and carry over funds to further build on our learnings and advance G1 Goals and student outcomes at CSCE

We hope the Commission would recognize the cause for the delayed expenditures and CSCE's

strategic use of these funds in tight alignment with Measure G1 Goals and to advance improved middle school student outcomes - though under delayed time table due to pandemic context shifts.
