 - Our school speaks mostly Spanish. Why is Spanish being offered? Do students take it?
 - We did not have much participation in Spanish in 2019-2020. We were thinking of incorporating more cultural activities within this class.
 However, that is a good point. We can recheck numbers and see if this is an appropriate use of funds.

 - Yes, Art will be both during the school day and after school.
