Approval by the Board of Education of Resolution No. 2021-0164 - Opposing the Automatic Two-Year Extension of Charter Terms

**Background** 

California law describes the process by which school districts review renewal petitions from charter schools and it dictates that districts make renewal decisions based on a variety of factors of which student outcomes are only one. The Governor's Proposed K-12 Education Trailer Bill (as of May 30, 2021) would automatically extend the terms of most existing charter schools by adding Section 47607.4 to the Education Code, which would read as follows

Notwithstanding the renewal process and criteria established in Sections 47605.9, 47607, and 47607.2 or any other law, effective July 1, 2021, all charter schools whose term expires on or between January 1, 2022, and June 30, 2025, inclusive, shall have their term extended by two years.


The Governor's Proposed K-12 Education Trailer Bill does not have any similar provision for the districts such as OUSD, which has been engaged with the County Office of Education and the California Collaborative for Educational Excellence because of now-outdated student outcome data; and

### Discussion

Currently, there are 24 charter schools authorized by OUSD with current terms that expire between January 1, 2022 and June 30, 2025. Of those 24 schools:

- 9 have terms ending June 30, 2022,
- 5 have terms ending June 30, 2023,
- 5 have terms ending June 30, 2024, and
- 5 have terms ending June 30, 2025.

Figure 1 illustrates the impact that Section 47607.4 would have on the renewal timing of OUSD-authorized charter schools.



If adopted, the Resolution would (i) formally express the Board's strong opposition to the inclusion of Section 47607.4, as written, in the Governor's Proposed K-12 Education Trailer Bill, (ii) direct the Superintendent to engage the District's lobbyists and any other existing resources or connections available to the District to advocate against the inclusion of Section 47607.4, as written, in the Governor's Proposed K-12 Education Trailer Bill, (iii) directs the Superintendent and General Counsel to explore all possible means to challenge the inclusion of Section 47607.4, as written, in the Governor's Proposed K-12 Education Trailer Bill; and (iv) encourages other school districts as well as statewide associations and advocacy organizations to join with the District and oppose the inclusion of Section 47607.4, as written, in the Governor's Proposed K-12 Education Trailer Bill.

This resolution was introduced on June 9, 2021 and now comes before the Board for approval.

### **Opposing the Automatic Two-Year Extension of Charter Terms**

**WHEREAS,** state law describes the process by which school districts review renewal petitions from charter schools and dictates that districts make renewal decisions based on a variety of factors of which student outcomes are only one;

WHEREAS, the Governor's Proposed K-12 Education Trailer Bill (as of May 30, 2021) would add Section 47607.4 to the Education Code to read as follows: "Notwithstanding the renewal process and criteria established in Sections 47605.9, 47607, and 47607.2 or any other law, effective July 1, 2021, all charter schools whose term expires on or between January 1, 2022, and June 30, 2025, inclusive, shall have their term extended by two years";

**WHEREAS,** there are twenty four (24) charter schools authorized by OUSD with current terms that expire between January 1, 2022 and June 30, 2025;

### WHEREAS, of those 24 schools:

- nine (9) schools have terms ending June 30, 2022,
- five (5) schools have terms ending June 30, 2023,
- five (5) schools have terms ending June 30, 2024, and
- five (5) schools have terms ending June 30, 2025;

**WHEREAS**, the impact of Section 47607.4 would deny the ability of the Board of Education to properly and timely review a significant number of charter petitions, including some that may not otherwise have their petitions renewed if they fail to meet the criteria necessary for renewal;

WHEREAS, the Governor's Proposed K-12 Education Trailer Bill does not have any similar provision for the districts such as OUSD, which has been engaged with the County Office of Education and the California Collaborative for Educational Excellence because of now-outdated student outcome data; and

**WHEREAS,** Section 47607.4 undermines the spirit of local control and the new charter school policy framework enacted under Assembly Bill No. 1505.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** the Board of Education is strongly opposed to the inclusion of Section 47607.4, as written, in the Governor's Proposed K-12 Education Trailer Bill;

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** the Board directs the Superintendent to engage the District's lobbyists and any other existing resources or connections available to the District to advocate against the inclusion of Section 47607.4, as written, in the Governor's Proposed K-12 Education Trailer Bill;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Board directs the Superintendent and General Counsel to explore all possible means to challenge the inclusion of Section 47607.4, as written, in the Governor's Proposed K-12 Education Trailer Bill; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Board encourages other school districts as well as statewide associations and advocacy organizations to join with the District and oppose the inclusion of Section 47607.4, as written, in the Governor's Proposed K-12 Education Trailer Bill.
