## **Strengths**

 Proposed school leadership team has a demonstrated commitment to serving the Elmhurst community.

 Petitioners are deeply motivated by the low student achievement in the area, and are proposing some effective instructional strategies to address the root causes of that low achievement.







### **Challenges**

- Numerous and substantial inconsistencies within the petition, as well as between the petition and the capacity interviews.
- There is a significant dearth of details of how to operationalize the proposed program.
- The petition does not demonstrate an understanding of how the proposed school would impact the existing Elmhurst school communities
- The District is not positioned to absorb the fiscal impact of a new charter school, due to being under state receivership.









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
