OUSD's drivers were a lifeline to the community by transporting essential supplies such as food and technology across the District. District properties had to be cleaned and maintained, which meant OUSD staff members had to continue to clean and ensure the functionality and beauty of OUSD schools and facilities. OUSD schools and other facilities had to remain secure, which was largely the job of school security officers who continued their work and also supported concurrent efforts such as food distribution, technology distribution, and vaccination clinics.


