Transitional Kindergarten: Background

The 2010 Kindergarten Readiness Act created Transitional Kindergarten (TK) in California

Children eligible for TK turn 5 between September 2 and December 2 of the current school year

TK is intended to provide extra time and a developmentally appropriate curriculum to prepare for kindergarten

TK teachers are required to hold a teaching credential (same requirements that authorize to teach kindergarten)

By August 2015, TK teachers additionally required to have 24 units of early childhood education (ECE); a Child Development Teacher permit; or classroom experience equivalent to 24 ECE units, as defined by LEA

No state mandated TK curriculum; intended to be aligned to the CA Preschool Learning Foundations

LEAs are allowed flexibility to determine how to meet curricular needs (e.g., combining TK and K and/or TK and CSPP in the same classroom)

OUSD opened 11 classrooms in 2010 and in 2015 previous leadership moved to TK for all sites with the execution of 7 elementary schools which caused multiple TK/K combos moving away from the purpose of TK.









California Budget & TK

Transitional Kindergarten Expansion

Expands TK beginning in 2022-23, and achieves universal TK by 2025-26

Max class size: 24

Ratio of 1:12, beginning 2022-23 1:10, beginning 2023-24

Beginning Aug. 2023, credentialed TK teachers must have 24 ECE units, or equivalent classroom experience, or child development teacher permit

May implement earlier than incremental timeline using ETK, but only earn ADA when child turns 5

Family choice

CSPP contractors may offer wrap-around childcare services for eligible TK and K children











California Budget & TK Resources

- \$490M one-time General Fund for CSPP, TK, and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Programs (May be used to construct new facilities or retrofit existing school facilities)
- \$300M one-time Prop 98 for the CA Pre-Kindergarten Planning and Implementation Grant Program
- \$200M to LEAs for creating or expanding CSPP or TK programs, or to establish or strengthen partnerships with other providers of Pre K education
- LEAs must develop a plan by June 30, 2022, for how all children will have access to full-day learning programs the year before K that meet the needs of parents, including through partnerships with LEA's expanded learning offerings, ASES program, CSPP, HS program, and other community-based early learning and care programs
- \$100M to LEAs for competitive grants to increase the number of highly qualified teachers and administrators available to serve CSPP and TK students









California Budget & TK-12

Teacher Qualification and PD Resources

One-time Prop 98 funds:

- \$1.5B for **Educator Effectiveness Block Grant** (5 yrs) to provide LEAs with flexible resources for PD for teachers, administrators, and other staff (specific focus areas)
- \$350M for **Teacher Residency Grant Program** (5 yrs) to support existing and new teacher residency programs that recruit and support the preparation of teachers in designed shortage fields, including SPED, bilingual ed, science, computer science, TK, K, and others



\$250M National Board for Professional Teaching Standards Certification Incentive Program

\$125M to CTC for **CA Classified School Employee Teacher Credentialing Program**, to assist classified employees in obtaining teaching credentials; expands program eligibility to expanded learning and early childhood education program staff







California Budget & TK-12

TK-12 Program Resources

Increases concentration grant add-on adjustment as part of LCFF calculation from 50% to 65% of base grant -- to increase school site staffing, including custodial staff

Establishes the **Expanded Learning Opportunities Program** to provide access to after-school and intersessional expanded learning programs

LEAs allocated funds based on enrollment of unduplicated (low income, foster, EL), TK-6

Teachers and PD Resources

One-time Prop 98 funds:

- \$37.7M (over 3 years) for **Early Math Initiative** (Fresno COE)
- \$10M for **Anti-bias Education Grant Program** to prevent, address, and eliminate racism in all CA public schools
- \$10M for the **Dual Language Immersion Grant Program**. Grants to LEAs or consortia over 3 years to expand and create new dual language immersion programs

State Preschool Programs (CSPP)



- Children eligible to participate in CSPP include those whose 5th birthday occurs after Sept. 1 of the fiscal year in which they are enrolled and whose parent/guardian has opted to retain them in CSPP
- Revise Standard Reimbursement Rate (SRR) to reflect COLA (4.05%)
- Beginning January 1, 2022, contractors to receive the higher of SRR or 75% percentile of 2018 RMR survey
- Certain adjustment factors applicable only prior to January 1, 2022
- Family fees waived for 2021-22 (reimbursed in full)

District Plan

Due to CDE June 30, 2022

The plan should include:

- How all children will have access to full-day learning programs the year before K
- That meet the needs of parents;
- Including through partnerships with:
 - LEA's expanded learning offerings
 - ASES program
 - CSPP
 - HS program
 - other community-based early learning and care programs

- Eligibility: funding allocation based on low-income, foster, EL students











PreK & TK Programs:

- Will you continue to offer CSPP part-day preschool for 3 and 4 YOs?
- Will you consider offering CSPP full-day preschool for 3 and 4 YOs?
- What do you know about the needs and preferences of your families for part-day, school-day, full-day options? Eligibility? Etc.?
- What assumptions can you make about how CSPP enrollment will be impacted by TK expansion?
- What considerations do you have for partnering with community-based, Head Start, or FCCHEN organizations to provide early education options for children and families?
- How are you currently providing extended day/year programs for TK and K students?
- Will you use CSPP funds for wraparound services?
- What other resources and partnerships are available for wraparound services?









Facilities:

- What are projections for classroom needs across district sites?
- Where are current PreK and TK classrooms? Adjustments needed?
- New facilities needed for PreK or TK (or extended care)?
- Renovation of existing classrooms?
- Will current PreK classrooms be converted or remain PreK?
- Renovation of existing PreK classrooms (e.g., to serve younger students)

Staffing:

- Do you have qualified TK teachers?
- Do PreK teachers or other staff need support to earn credentials?
 - Barriers & opportunities
 - Credentialing residency program?
- Do credentialed teachers need support to earn 24 ECE units?
- Who will be the 2nd adult in TK classrooms?

- What resources can be leveraged to support extended day and year early learning opportunities for PreK, TK, and K students?
- What is status of pay/benefit equity for PreK teachers and assistants with TK-12 teaching staff? What opportunities are there?
- How will 2021-22 budget increases (one-time or ongoing) impact decisions about PreK and TK implementation?
- How will TK classrooms be staffed?
