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Overview

 Every high school can rollover all unexpended Measure N budget allocations from one year to the next

- Process: Sites submit 2020-21 Measure N Carryover
 Justification Form
 - Identifies why funds were not expended in 2020-21
 - Articulates clear plan for use of funds in 2021-22

Review & Approval Process

- **Step 1:** School sites submit Carryover Justification Form
- Step 2: High School Supervisors and Measure N Team review Justification Forms to ensure expenses are permissible and aligned to pathway development
- Step 3: Approval of Carryover Justification Form by Measure N
 Commission and School Board
- **Step 4:** School sites can access carryover funds

October 20-27, 2021	High School Supervisors and Measure N staff review and provide feedback on plans				
November 3, 2021	Deadline for submission of Final Carryover Justification Forms				
November 16, 2021	Approval of Carryover Justification Forms at Measure N Commission meeting				
Mid-December 2021 (after Board Approval)	Schools can access carryover funds				













Multiple Pathway Schools

- Average carryover amount is 18.2% of their total 2020-21 funding allocation
- 4 of the 6 sites decreased their carryover amounts since last fiscal year









Small Schools



- Average carryover amount is **37.7%** of their total 2020-21 funding allocation
- 2 of the 5 schools decreased their carryover amounts since last fiscal year









Alternative Education Schools



- Average carryover amount is 59.3% of their total 2020-21 funding allocation
- 1 of the 6 schools decreased its carryover amount since last fiscal year







Charter Schools



- Average carryover amount is 20.7% of their total 2020-21 funding allocation
- 2 of the 9 schools decreased their carryover amounts since last fiscal year
