Staff presentation - Phil Dotson, Acting Coordinator, OUSD Charter Schools Office.

Mr. Dotson said the legislative intent regarding accountability for charter schools is to improve pupil learning; hold schools accountable for measurable pupil outcomes; and to provide schools with a method to change from rule based to performance based accountability systems. The expectation is that schools released from the Education Code will improve pupil learning and perform better than District schools. Protocol used for consideration for charter renewals is based on these key ideas and includes a review of the school's performance over the charter term with reference to a rubric that defines what the District considers a quality charter school.

Regarding Aspire Golden State:

- The school opened in 2008 as part of the Aspire Public School CMO which includes seven different schools in the Oakland area.
- This is the first charter renewal for this school.
- Current enrollment is 485 students in grades 6-12. Enrollment consists of 68% Latino, 29% African American and 3% designated as other.
- Special Education services are provided by the El Dorado County Office of Education.
- The school reports 80% of its students receive free or reduced lunch, 7% percent receive Special Education services and 24% percent are English Language Learners.

Strengths recognized on OUSD Staff's visit:

- A commitment by key stakeholders to achieve the charter mission described in the petition.
- Students have the opportunity to attend college through a Junior College system while attending high school.
- Staff interviews with families indicate the families were very satisfied with the educational program at the school.
- The financial oversight is thorough, pro-active, long range and conservative.

Challenges

- Over four years prior to the renewal, the school experienced a 38 point jump in its API Score. In the last year the school experienced a 47 point loss.
- The school failed to meet its measureable outcomes in several areas.
- In September 2011 the school had to move and the result of the move may have had some cultural changes to the school.

Staff Recommendation:

Based on the analysis of Aspire Golden State Academy performance outcomes and evaluation of its program over the past four years, the school is deem academically sound, an effective, viable organization for the purpose of renewal. Based on the review by the Office of Charter Schools, the school's records and performances is deemed to have been faithful to the terms of its charter. It is the recommendation by the staff that Aspire Golden State College Preparatory Academy be approved with the conditions as revised to include the terms and conditions enumerated in the staff report.

Public Comments

Jim Mordecai urged the Board to decline support for Aspire Charter School. Mr. Mordecai said one of the problems is Aspire makes reference to employees will sign off a child abuse form, but they don't say what's on the form. He said his concern is if employees suspect child abuse, they should contact Child Protective Services.

Board Member Comments

Director London said she is concerned about the drop in the school's API Score.

Mr. Dotson said a school may take a dip up or down in any given year. Identifying the source of that dip is the principal's job. The Office of Charter Schools met with the principal and is confident they understand the data and that the organization has to be data driven. He said there is a process if the school does not move forward with the conditions of the renewal.

Director London wanted to know if the District will be monitoring the school.

Mr. Dotson said "Yes" and the Office of Charter Schools will also work with the school to identify some of their pupil measureable outcomes to see where the District can tweak them to meet the needs of the students. He said the District will be hands on with the school.

Director Yee said he plans to support staff's recommendation because he has a degree of confidence in Aspire's interest in maintaining a high level of accountability within its network of schools.

David Montes de Oca said the specific intent is to provide an increased amount of monitoring after the second year so that the District can monitor pupil outcomes. One of the four aspects of charter revocations is not meeting pupil outcomes. Mr. Montes de Oca noted although the school had a drop of 47 points in its API Score last year, the school gained 38 point over the last four years.

Director Yee said the District's responsibility for oversight of charter schools, it seems to him a heavy responsibility to maintain year to year analysis of student achievement and to bring any kinds of actions between renewals.

Staff Report – Phil Dotson, Office of OUSD Charter School.

Mr. Dotson said the same charter renewal standards were applied to East Oakland Leadership as with Aspire, the report will refer to the school as EOLA.

- The school opened in 2003.
- Current enrollment is 116 student of K-8th grade.
- Current demographics: 66% Latino, 30% African American and 4% Asian.
- Special Educations services are provided by the District.
- The school reports 93% of the population receive free or reduced lunch.
- Eleven percent receive Special Education services.
- Fifty five percent are English Language Learners.

Between 2009 and 2012 the school has grown its API Score by 58 points. Students moved from Proficient to Advance in English Language Arts from 30% to 49%. Students in Math moved from Proficient to Advance from 40% to 50%. The school's API Score grew from 709 in 2009 to 767 in 2012. The school has a high attendance rate and the Governing Board is actively involved in its fiscal management.

Challenges

- Lack ongoing professional development for teachers.
- The schools' capacity to attract students which can eventually effect their fiscal stability.
- The schools' measurable outcomes were not met in two out of five areas and partially met in one other area.
- Recent acquisition of new buildings have reduced the fiscal reserves of the school.

Findings of the Office of Charter Schools

Based on the analysis of East Oakland Leadership Academy's performance and outcomes and evaluations of its educational program over the past four years, the school is deemed to be academically sound for the purpose of renewal. Based on the analysis the school is deemed an effective and viable organization for the purposes of charter renewal. Based on the review of the schools' records and performance, the school is deemed to have been faithful to the terms of its charter petition as submitted.

Staff Recommendation

The Office of Charter Schools recommends the staff report be approved for EOLA with conditions as revised to include the terms and conditions in the staff report.

Board Member Comments

Director Harris said the he was shocked by the 60% graduation rate. He wanted to know how the school plans to address that issue although the school is a sound academic institution.

Mr. Dotson said it is up to the school to address the need for a high graduation rate.

Mr. Montes de Oca noted the school is a K-8 school and wanted to know if Director Harris is referring to their eight grade students? He said the Board received a Public Hearing for a separate charter operated by the same organization that serves grades 9-12 and that charter renewal will not be before the Board for another month.

Laura Armstrong said beginning at the eighth grade the school has a 100% graduation rate and most go on to the high school.

Director Yee said he noticed the small enrollment of the school and wanted to know if that was intended or was there some other reason and were there any concerns about the fiscal viability of the school at that size?

Mr. Dotson said the Office of Charter School does have some concerns about the fiscal viability. He said the school is aware of the concerns and is actively seeking to grow the school. He said the school has a large reserve which gives it room to grow.

Director Dobbins noted the school has stabilized the community although there is a liquor store in front of the school.

Public Comments

Jim Mordecai noted this school has direct language regarding child abuse and the previous school did not. He said the language should be included in all charter petition renewals. Mr. Mordecai asked the Board not to approve the charter renewal.

Staff Report by Phil Dotson, Office of Charter Schools.

Mr. Dotson said this is the fourth renewal term for the Oakland Charter Academy which opened in 1993 as part of the Amethod Charter Schools. Current enrollment is 235 students in grades 6-8. Current population is 66% Latino, 30% African American and 4% Asian. Special Education services are provided by the District. The school reports 88% of the students receive free or reduced lunch, 5% receive Special Education services and 52% are English Language Learners.

Strengths of the School noted by the Office of Charter School

- API Score of 867.
- High standards for all students as reflected in their commitment to hard work and college aspirations.
- Calm and orderly classrooms environments.
- School adheres to State Standards.
- Enthusiasm for the school and the program, extensive tutoring opportunities for students with their own classroom teacher, schoolwide data usage to address needs and active Governing Board involved in the oversight of academic and fiscal performance of the school

Challenges

- · New school leadership that has to build a rapport with the District.
- Lacks differential training within its teaching core.

The school is deemed to be academically sound for the purpose of renewal based on this analysis the school is deemed an effective, viable organization for the purposes of charter renewal. Based on a review of the school's records and performance, the school is deemed to have been faithful to the terms of its charter petition as submitted.

Staff Recommendation: To approve the charter petition as revised to include the required text revisions contained in the staff report.

Public Comments

Jim Mordecai said he had a note regarding a third grade teacher not stopping students from having sex in the classroom on numerous occasions. Mr. Mordecai asked the question "What do we do when mandated reporters do not report?" Mr. Mordecai said the Board has to support staff's recommendation because the charter school did everything

they were supposed to do.

I. New Business

Finance and Human Resources Matter(s)

California State Budget (Proposed) - Education - Fiscal Year 2013-2014

Presentation by the Superintendent of Schools or designee on the Governor's Proposed 2013-2014 State Budget, in particular Education, its Local Control Funding Formula and the prospective impact on the District.

Deputy Superintendent Vernon Hal lead the staff discussion with the aid of a PowerPoint Presentation. Mr. Hal said the Governor has presented the State Budget for 2013/2014 fiscal year.

The Process

- 1. The Governor releases his budget in January.
- 2. The State Legislature comes up with a proposed budget.
- 3. The Governor comes out with the May Revise
- 4. Hopefully, before June 30th, the State passes a State Budget.

Slide 1 - Theme of the Governor's Budget.

Mr. Hal said for the first time in over five years it looks like education funding on a per pupil basis will increase based on the Governor's Budget. In addition, the Governor is proposing a different funding model called the Local Control Funding Formula that reallocates funds to the different school districts. Schools typically receive their funding through Average Daily Attendance (ADA). He said for every dollar the District should receive the State only gives the District about eighty cents. When the District is supposed to receive Cost of Living Adjustments the State does not fund the additional increase, it only funds seventy five cents on the dollar. He said currently the way school districts finance work there is a lot of deferrals. Whatever money the District is supposed to receive in a particular year, the State has deferred sending the money to the District until the next year to help with their cash flow which hurts the District's cash flow. He said part of the proposal is to start paying districts on time.

Slide 2 – Higher Funding

The Governor is proposing a different method of distributing funds through the Local Control Formula. A certain dollar amount goes toward education and has gone out to schools in a certain way. The Governor is now proposing for it to be allocated differently. The Governor is proposing to focus more on the resources of the students most needy. California receives far less on average than other states.

Slide 3 - US Economic Outlook

The U.S. Economy has been plagued by slow. The cut in payroll taxes was allowed to expire so taxpayers are paying more in payroll taxes. Still unresolved is what the Federal Government will do regarding any cuts to Federal Programs.

Slide 4 – California Outlook

California is slowly recovering and has a long way to go. The State has added about \$564,000 of the \$1.4 million lost during the recession. The unemployment rate has dropped to 9.8%, but still higher than the overall 7.7% for the United States.

Slide 5 – What California Spends Compared to the National Average in the Top Five States.

California is almost \$1,800 per ADA lower than the National Average and the top five states

spends almost twice as much as California does.

What the Governor is Proposing

More dollars and a reallocation of the dollars. The increase in District funding is dependent largely on the economy of the State and the Nation getting better. The rising health care costs will continue to strain the State Budget. Other budget priorities could threatened resources in the Governor's proposal for education.

Proposition 98

Guarantees money for K-12 education.

Distribution of those resources:

- \$1.8 billion to reduce deferrals
- \$1.6 billion to start the implementation of Local Control Funding Formula
- \$400 million to support energy efficient projects
- \$62.8 million for the \$1.65% cost of living adjustment for selected State resources

The Governor is proposing a sweeping reform of how school district receive their resources allocated to them.

Slide 6 – The Cost of Living Adjustment - \$1.65% The District's per ADA is about \$111.

Major Elements of the Local Control Formula

This will replace Revenue Limit Dollars and most Categorically Funded Programs

The redistribution will be based on English Learners and pupils eligible for free and reduced lunch.

Slide 7 – Revenue Limits and Categorical

There are dollar the District will continue to receive that are not part of that group of resources: Special Education, Child Nutrition, QUEIA Funds, After School, ACES and all the Federally Mandated Programs. The District will continue to receive these funds as it has received in the past.

How Much is Funded?

The funds the District receives will be redistributed to add funding to build the pot. It is believed to fully fund the new version will cost the State \$15 billion. The State is proposing to set aside \$1.6 billion. The Governor is proposing to look at what the need is compared to what the school districts currently receive and fund about ten percent of that amount.

Board Member Comments

Director London talked about health care cost continuing to rise and wanted to know if the District has investigated joining a larger pool. She said right now the District is its own pool.

Mr. Hal said there was a cost containment committee with all the union representatives. He said ten percent on an annual basis is alarming.

Director London said it does not look like the State is providing funds to help with the transition to the Common Core Standards.

Mr. Hal said there was not funding for it.

Vice President Hinton Hodge wanted to know if there are other adjustments the District may need to pay attention to.

Mr. Hal said if this happens, one of the resources included is EIA Funds. He said under the model those funds become the basis for funding the new model and the restrictions go

away.

Vice President Hinton Hodge wanted to know if Title I funds are flexed?

Mr. Hal said in the Governor's proposed budget is for State; Titles I, II and III are Federal Funds.

Director Torres wanted to know what the Governor was doing to bring about a change to Prop 13, in particular commercial versus residential property. She said that would produce billions of dollars for the State and education.

Mr. Hal said during discussions the District had at the State level there was no discussion about changing the taxing of California other than Prop 30.

President Kakishiba said the Board will revisit this item in March with the Second Interim Report. He said there will be a lot more information at that time. He said the Superintendent had projected flat funding for all schools at this year's level is still in play. The idea of the 1.65% COLA is not being factored in now because of some uncertainty and supplemental funding for English Learners and Low Income will have to get thrashed out Legislatively in the next several months.

President Kakishiba said whether or not the Board take a position on the Governor's proposed Local Control Funding, he recommends the Superintendent give a recommendation regarding a Resolution in support of the spirit of the Governor's proposal.

Public Comments

Marilyn Noble said she was handing out a brief explanation of an alternative funding proposal that has not gotten the attention of everyone else. She said the major difference between the Governor's proposal and the Legislative Analysis proposal is the Legislative Analysis proposal wants a funding stream for Adult Education but the Governor wants all funding to go to the community college level.

Discussed

J. Adoption of the General Consent Report No. 1

Jim Mordecai said on page 20 of the agenda, Legislative File ID 13-0168 Compliance with Annual Organizational Requirements, he said his concern with this item is when the Board had its Organizational Meeting the Board did not appoint the Chair of the Measure G Committee which it is required to do annually under Measure G.
