Sub-Committee and Focus Group Reports and Development of Recommendations

Foster Youth Focus Group

Rene Swain from CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate) addresses the group. Nicole Wiggins, High School Liaison for MSFE, SSC member of Oakland High; Zefora Muniz, former foster student, works with former foster youth who are UC Berkeley students. Rene reports on the subgroup focus group that was held in March. On April 6th a subgroup met and created some recommendations. 4 recommendations for LCAP implementation: (see packet for full language)

- 1. Additional Caseworker for Alternative High Schools
- 2. Fund to support school site liaisons to support foster youth
- 3. Workshop and support series for Foster parents, multiple sessions to help them help their children
- 4. Stipends to support current foster youth and former foster youth in the advisory process

Nicole asks Ms Johnson to share as a foster parent. She has a Senior who wants to attend college out of state and has been doing her own research to find out about resources. She also learned through the LCAP connections that through AB12 her daughter could possibly continue in foster care while in college.

Rene: we need a support group to let parents know about resources that are available, so that it doesn't go unused.

Questions:

Dr Baccheus: Q re recommendation #3. What about middle school workshop?

Answer: it would be included in high school.

Dr Baccheus: If you list it then it will not be omitted.

Rene: we will list middle school

Q: re #3: It says 6 sessions: what does that mean? Is it a six week series? Will the resources be available online?

A: The ideal is that there are 6 report cards during the year, and the workshops would coincide with the marking periods. We will have a FAQ sheet online.

Q: Worried about drop-off and retention. A parent might receive a child in the middle of the year.

A: the topics are stand alone, so you can jump in at any time. We will contract with someone who will hold the information and you can go to that person. The sessions will be ongoing from year to year. The school liaisons will help with this.

Q: About transportation to support a foster student with special needs who needs rides for treatment.

A: We need to bring this problem up to Lidell. There may be resources available.

Q: How many foster youth have been identified in OUSD? A: Approx 450 as of March.

JJ calls for a vote on the Foster Youth Subgroup recommendations, reminds members of gradients of agreement rules. Members raise cards with numbers in the air: 5=5 votes; 4=four votes; 3=1 vote; 2=1 vote; 1= 0 votes.

JJ asks for Hilda to explain why she voted "2." Hilda: I know that Foster Youth have a lot of need, but so do PEC children, but we have not touched on their needs during these meetings this year.

A: About 35% of Foster Youth are SPED students.

JJ: SPED is a focus for LCAP, just not the focus for tonight's vote.

Hilda: I would like for there to be a focus within the foster youth subgroup on SPEC foster youth.

Changes her vote to "3." We have consensus.

English Learners' Sub-Committee

Committee

English learner subcommittee: Judith, Cesar and Luz.

English only speakers are invited to use headsets for simultaneous translation.

Luz: We met three times. Our minutes are available for review in the packet.

Four Recommendations: (see packet for full language)

- 1. A report listing each of the actions from school SPSAs to support goal 4, will be available on Sept 1 to be reviewed by subcommittee in September.
- 2. MSFE and Community Engagement will work with Network Superintendents to ensure that schools utilize the English Learner Snapshot, including children with IEPs. The plan will begin implementation on or before April 1, 2017.
- 3. ELLMA and World Languages Dept will begin a discussion about how to develop dual language programs in languages other than Spanish.
- 4. Develop Standards for the administration of the CELDT test, including accommodations and modifications for students with IEPs and 504 plans, including a revised CELDT calendar that would allow schools to access CELDT information in time to plan for instruction during the year.

JJ motions to adopt the recommendations.

Student members ask for a minute to review the recommendations.

- Q: Brittany: In Q3, are we asking to develop programs to teach children more than one language? What is a dual language program. A: there is a bilingual program for children learning English, and there is immersion to teach children to learn a second language.
- Q: How do Newcomer Students play a role in the EL Subcommittee recommendations?
- A: tracking of outcomes for ELs. In goal 4 actions there are specific goals for newcomers. Several categoriesi of ELLs: newcomers (less than 12 months); recent (0-3 years); at risk: 3-6 years. Longterm ELLs—(more than 6 years but have not been reclassified)
- Q: re recommendation #4: why would it take so long to implement the accomodations and modifications for students with special needs for CELDT. My daughter is in 9th grade, and this implementation timeline would leave her out, she will be in 11th grade and that is too late
- A: It is a suggestion. We want to set a timeline that is reasonable to accomplish the goals, and to give staff time to plan.
- JJ moves to adopt the recommendations. Members raise their numbers: 5=four votes; 4= five votes; 3= four votes.

Goal 6 is both family involvement and also shared decision making. We will meet in the library and do a world café and talk about translation services, support for shared decision making and
