Commissioner Gary Yee started the conversation on his observation and spoke about:

- Looked over all the Education Improvement Plans and observed the following 9 points for discussion
- Difficult to see if teachers in any school who participate in the design
- While there are shifts to 8 period day, no one had discussed extended day could find very little funding for extended year, alternative schedules or any like that
- No one has discussed engagement of after school and community school staff
- Some charters need additional prep support or engagement from Linked Learning office
- Leadership turnover creates need for re-commitment of staff leadership
- Teacher turnover means new teachers How do you maintain a Professional Development and how does it get funded
- Can additional CTE classes be available even if students have to make up A-G courses? Would like to see CTE classes prioritized for all kids
- Increasing numbers of internships being identified will require partners being recruited to add internship capacity
- Skyline High School brochure is promising; Want to see Career Pathway Measure N brochure for parents and students

After Commissioner Gary Yee shared, the Commission discussed about:

- Doing a compilation of consolidated budget on how Measure N dollars are being spent
- To see if the observations are part of the scope of the Commission
- Extended the day
- What is the District doing around 9th graders walking to high school and not being adequately equipped with literacy skills?
- Thinking about how internships are being supported at a collective level with a bird's eye view
- The questions to focus on is what is the right things for me to stay focus on? and what is the right things for me to span?
- How to support schools making the most of their partners on site
- Could have put more work to it such as to have anonymous all staff survey
- To have downward accountability for site leaders
- To have support for Charter Schools
- Having some tools to capture all the Pathways and describing them where they are at
- How the school is spending the budgets
- Innovative practices to help promote the cross pollination
- Being able to widely communicate
- Staffing issues

Resources Strategies

Nisha Garg, from Education Resources Strategies (ERS) presented the OUSD High School Design presentation and after Commissioner discussed about the following points:

- Across grade levels, an increasing share of students are under-scheduled, with those in 12th grade missing out on approximately 2 periods of learning time
- Year over year, student only complete approximately 87% of attempted credits
- Across OUSD's school types, the use of instructional time varies dramatically
- The typical master schedule only allows for 240 credits
- Given limited time and variations in the use, are 9th graders set up for graduation
- Only 54% of OUSD's nigh schools are set up for a typical student to meet the graduation and A-G requirements in 4 years
- Coliseum College Preparatory Academy intersession model provides targeted remediation opportunities
- Grades in 9th grade courses are most likely to decline, regardless of first semester mark
- OUSD teachers have relatively less time to prepare for the array of content they are teaching
- Looking across OUSD high schools, 64% of schools have teacher utilization of 75% or more
- Students only complete an average of 87% of attempted credits
- 73% of completed credits are A-G aligned, and there is a wide variation in course-taking patterns across schools
- When the principal survey was completed in the timeline
- What needs to happen for OUSD to:
 - -Increase planning time in the school day
 - -Create purposeful cross-content teaching teams
 - -Create cross school learning communities
 - -Invest in instructional coaches
 - -Differentiated teacher role
 - -Wildcard option?
- Hold a core commitment that the Measure N Commission is approving plans that demonstrate a deeply thoughtful root cause analysis desegregation of data
