Preston Thomas, Executive Director, College and Career Readiness spoke on the 2015-2016 Baseline inventory of Oakland Unified School District Career Pathway programs regarding:

- 2015-16 Enrollment by School
- Percent of pathway students vs. Non-pathway students
- 2015-16 District Pathway Enrollment
- 2015-16 School Pathway Enrollment: All Grades
- Will figure out a reporting mechanism for charter schools around pathways participations in the reports
- Bunche High School pathway enrollment
- Bunche Demographic comparison

The Commissioners and Staff discussed about:

- In Oakland High School what would a career be like for the students that are taking AAMA-Khepera Pathway and AVID Pathway
- Over the course of last year, AAMA-Khepera Pathway and AVID Pathway went through the Measure N process and now have identified the career sector that they are focusing on
- AAMA-Khepera Pathway is around Entrepreneurship and AVID Pathway is Public Service focused on Social Justice and Leadership
- Courses being tag as A-G compliance in student enrolled
- High school readiness is, did you past the English class, did you past your Math class, is the GPA 2.5 and above, were you not suspended during the entire 8th grade year, was your attendance rate over 96%
- When that is being track on a student when they transition into high school, students do amazingly well
- The middle school is now looking at high school readiness as a big indicator for their work
- In the pathway development school by school, are school sites thinking along the indicators?
- Having additional student support staff makes a big difference through Measure N allocations
- Skyline High School has 3 certified pathways
- All grades 55% of all schools are co-hart 1 schools; schools like Skyline, Tech, and Castlemont would be a transformative school in three years
- Looked at 10 years ago and now the District enrollment for high schools are pretty stable
- Most students are lost in the transition from 5th to 6th grade and second biggest lost is 8th grade to 9th grade transition
- Biggest gain in students is in the 10th grade
- How can the Baseline Report be communicated out to the public?
- In December meeting there will be a representative from the Communication

Department to make a report on how to get the Baseline information out to the public

- How is the Baseline Report being shared internally?

- Concern that African American Male Achievement (AAMA) being a pathway
- Racial Segregation in pathways that was raised
- Wants to make sure that all students from 9th grade and on are in a pathway
- Some schools have one pathway and there should be a magnet school; for example, if you want to be in a specific pathway then the student should attend this school
- There should be one other choice in pathway if there's only one pathway in a certain school
- In Castlemont High School there's Leadership Public School that shares the same campus; to talk about how it can collaborate together

Measure N Commission - 2016-2017 Measure N Funding Allocations to High Schools - Administrative Guidance - Implementation of Allowable Uses of Measure N Guidelines

Approval by Measure N Commission of Administrative Guidance for 2016-2017 Measure N funding allocations to high schools regarding Implementation of Allowable use of Measure N Guidelines.

Preston Thomas, Executive Director College and Career Readiness, spoke on:

- Allocating the purpose of the funding
- Goals of Measure N
- Trying to get precise on what schools can use for budgeting
- Initially 80% was being loaded, based on the current state of enrollment in OUSD, its safe to utilized 85% as the target
- Start of the projections based on CALPADS data from the previous year
- Want to have something that is consistent across charter and Oakland Unified School District schools
- Funds would be issued to the school site and loaded into the budgets and payment would be given to charter schools in a form of a check
- Payment two would be issued around November, it would be consisting of the remainder of the 15% Measure N funds allocated to school sites based on their confirmed enrollment
- OUSD High Schools will have their funding loaded into their site budgets
- Charter schools will be issued their second check
- Tracking charter schools funding is little different, so they would have to confirmed their enrollment and submit their financial report to the High School Linked Learning Office explaining their expenditure from the previous year
- The District will address the enrollment decrease to create the least impact on academic program
- The goal is to not negatively impact the school plans that the school have already put into place
- If there is any carry over that the site has the previous year that that would be used to fill in the gap
- The second would be disbursing funds from the school reserves fund

- The next would be to reduce Measure N funding allocation for the next year if both options are not feasible
- Articulated the used of "School Reserve Fund" = Ideas that came up from the Commission or Staff throughout the last year:
- -To mitigate negative financial impact
- -Measure N revenue short fall that would impact instructional program
- -Expiration of Measure N
- If recommended by the Measure N Commission and approved by the Oakland Unified School District School Board theses school funds can be used to support:
 - Innovative programs and pilots that will continue to better student's outcomes
 - Support Site Visits
- High schools can rollover all unexpended Measure N budget allocations from one fiscal year to the next fiscal year, for a period not to exceed three consecutive fiscal year
- In order to carry it over, the site must complete a Carryover Justification Form"
- All unexpended Measure N budget allocations that are carried over from the previous year will be dispersed as follows:
- -15% of the total carry over amount of each school site will be set aside for school site visits
- The rest of the carry over amount will be dispersed to the whole school and pathways on a per pupil basis

The Commission and Staff discussed about:

- Under carryover, for the 15%, is there a due date on that to used it by?
- How does Pathway schools decide where to do a site visit?
- Is there any crossed school collaboration, especially around extended year
- For schools to talk about the real dilemma of implementing pathway design
- To reframe so that is clearer about the difference between a school reserve fund and contingency fund
- To support the development of internships for students; to have stipend as an incentive

Gregory Cluster, Work Base Learning Coordinator, spoke on:

- One of the allowable uses is to support the development of internships for students
- To have stipend as an incentive for students
- Want to expand Summer internship programs and want it to be paid by stipend for students
- Schools are looking at Measure N carryover funds; could it be devoted to student Summer internship stipend that goes directly to students

The Commission and Gregory Cluster spoke about:

- Would asked to partner up with the City of Oakland to find more fund to support student stipend
- Sounds like Measure N is not interested in blocking the use of carryover to use as a student summer internship stipend
- Hiring alumni to come back and help as tutor

- How do we attract professional in the area to come teach our students with our low salary?
- Students need to be taught on what class to take and which college to attend in order to be successful
