Ms. Jean Wing presents three years of student outcome data to demonstrate progress towards the six LCAP goals.

Questions:

What is the current strategy to encourage students to stay in school so OUSD can reach the 3% increase goal for graduation.

• Support students in staying school a 5th year or enroll in community college to make up credits. Also, encouraging students to enroll in dual enrollment to gain more credit for both high school and college.

Why does it take so long to get graduation data for most recent completed school year?

OUSD needs information from the state on how students' location and graduation trends are classified (for cohort graduation numbers). This information typically is not released until April.

Does this mean that of all the students who took the AP exam only 10% got 3 or higher?

- The data point if that 10% of all students both took and passed and AP score.
- Students who took more than 1 test are only counted once.

Are teachers who are on emergency credentials considered mis-assigned?

No

Do we have numbers for how many teachers are teaching on special assignment? How

effective are they?

- We could probably get that but the information is by school; those teachers are distributed throughout the city.
- About teacher gaps: K-3 class size reduction increases the need for teachers.

Where can we find this data?

Go to ousd.data.org. You can find this and more and sort by race ethnicity, gender, etc.

(Comment) Why are students being asked to bring outdated books that aren't being used to school. There has to be a better system/indicator to determine the access to quality of instructional materials.

Lisa Spielman, LCAP Program Manager Introduces herself. She explains that the LCAP is not an easy document to follow. The state has made changes to the document to make it easier. This is called a new template.

The template is reorganized in a way that makes sense.

- 1. Info about the district: demographics and strengths, challenges, sets the context for the focus for 17-18.
- 2. Annual update: reflection on the current year. What we implemented with successes and challenges.
- 3. School year 17-18 Academic and Social-Emotional Learning Plan: How we will accelerate learning.

OUSD has been providing info on ALL of our students, including Special Education. In OUSD we have information on 65% of our budget. We also include fiscal information: \$502 million included. We are the only district that includes Base as well as S&C. We have been recognized for this. Because we provide so much information.

Q: D7 Member: Who is the information for? We want transparency. Parents need information to understand the process.

A: the info that you have had for 2 years may not be in the LCAP but we have other tools we will share with you so you can track how we are spending our money. We have ways of providing that information.

Q: D1 Member: you say that you are going to provide info off line but the information that you have online is not easily accessible, so we will have to ask someone to make the information accessible. My question is who is making this decision? You need to include us in the decision rather than telling us what information you are going to provide us with.

A: I appreciate this comment. We will be setting up feedback sessions with the PSAC about this topic.

Q: D6 Member: How will we include Special Education programs and students? The proposal would eliminate that information.

Comment: There is special nuance for Special Education. The Special Education Study Group went through every LCAP action looking for SPED. Actions for students with IEP's are not woven throughout the goals and strategies. The committee must decide how we engage with the lack of detail for Special Education. We need some leadership from the group to see how families, students, and other people who support students with IEP's can best be part of this conversation.

Comment from D7 member: This is part of the District is trying to hide how it uses the money.

Q: Lisa: There will be a scheduled meeting to follow-up correct?

A: Cintya: We have EL Sub-Committee, Foster Youth Advisory, a Study Session about Teacher Retention, and a Lead Delegates meeting, basically a meeting every week. I guess we could schedule an additional meeting.

Comment by D1 Member: This body needs to determine if we want to have a special meeting we need to vote on it. I am going to move that we have a special meeting soon.

Q: Brittany: why wouldn't have the discussion tonight?

A: Cintya: we need more time than we have left on this agenda. After the meeting we have someone from the superintendent search firm here to give feedback.

A: Lisa: I recommend another meeting so we can more in depth and show what the LCAP would look like and show you the interactive tools.

Q: Brittany: Would you have a proposal for how we can hold you accountable for what is not being reported on. 75% of the district falls into the target groups, so it is basically the whole district is under LCAP and the things not being reported on are impacting students in the target groups.

A: Lisa we will include in the conversation.

Rocquel: I move that we have a special meeting on March 14 at 5:30 pm. Brittany: I second the motion.

Any objections? No Consensus voting.

Wendell calls the vote: 5 = 9 votes, 4=2 votes, 1 abstention Consensus is achieved. The motion carries.

Presentation about the Budget by Kyla Trammel-Johnson

When a former superintendent was here his responsibility was to start a budget prioritization process which called for 24 million in cuts. The board and community and schools had concerns about many of those proposals. Our board asked Senior Leadership to find another way to make cuts.

The reasons for the cuts were: declining enrollment which led to a 5.5 million decrease. Even with fewer students we have to pay for our buildings, utilities, and Special Education. Early Childhood Education costs more than 2 million but we don't get all the money we need from the state to cover it, so we have to continue to invest.

When you take into consideration declining enrollment and services which continue and the

costs continue to go up.

We decided to make 8.5 million in cuts to Central Office, which is 27 positions. We wanted to touch sites as little as possible.

We are reprioritizing Supplemental and Concentration dollars that were used to pay School Security Officers. We also have an appeals process where principals can ask for more positions. We are taking 4.2 million from the appeals bucket to pay for Foster Youth case managers and for materials for English Language Learners (a start) middle school math curriculum, common core teacher leaders—specialists that have been central are being deployed to sites to embed coaches in schools.

Q: What percentage of the 4.2 million is coming from SSOs?
The 4.2 million is only coming from the reduction of 10 SSOs and the reduction from appeals. Will you get us a list of what the money has been reallocated to.

Q: What materials are you referring to for English Language Learners?

A: Integrated ELD that is required by the state so that students develop academic English.

The state has changed the standards and we need to change our materials.

- Q: And Foster Youth?
- A: Mental health services and Social Emotional Learning investments
- Q: The common core specialists, are you saying the 4.2 is going to these things—does this decrease the overhead, does that save money?
- A: No, our theory of action —of how we will improve outcomes faster—is that the specialists will be at the school site full time instead of 2 or 3 times a week. We can't have both central coaches and school based coaches. We can't implement in all schools so we are starting with the schools with most need.
- Q: Revenues are flat: why?
- A: Good question for our Governor. The state is being conservative with their projections. We get our funding based on how many students we have. Our enrollment has been trending down so we need to be conservative so that we don't give schools more money and then have to take it back.
- Q: Prop 55 and Measure G just passed, but enrollment—don't charter schools count?

 A: The amount of money we get is not trending up, due to enrollment and because we are not getting a higher allocation from the state. Measure N, and Measure G1 are for specific school programs. We can't use it on operations.

 Charter school enrollment does not count.
