Lionel Wilson Preparatory Principal, Michelle Cortez, began her presentation by having one of her students, Alexis Delgado, read their school vision. The school vision stated, "All students should thrive and graduate critically literate and free to choose their college, career, and life pathway."

Ms. Cortez continued the presentation and spoke about the three most important pieces of the plan for year one:

- Prioritize Literacy:
- Extensive Library expansion based on culturally relevant texts, high-interest books, and teacher/student choice
- Hiring of full-time literacy specialist
- School wide implementation of Wilson Reads Reading Block and Leveled Literacy Intervention groups

- Content specific literacy strategies across grade levels
- On-going literacy observation, coaching, and professional development
- Monthly students' literacy celebrations and family literacy nights

Ms. Cortex introduced Carrie Berg, Literacy Specialist, and stated that with Measure N funds the school was able to hire her on board. Ms. Berg was hired to:

- Assists the principal, instructional coaches, and department leads to design and implement literacy RTI and content based strategy implementation
- Observes and coaches Wilson Reads and LLI
- Plans and facilitates professional development and family literacy events
- Coordinates and trains team of student librarians and HS WeRead Mentors
- Facilitates literacy data collection and analysis
- Adopted Curriculum and Blending Learning
- Master Schedule designed for block classes
- Pathways aligned electives and college classes
- Adoption of comprehensive ELA Curriculum
- Additional staff members hired to allow for grade level content specialization
- Increased access to computers (6:7 ratio)
- Use of integrated platforms (Hapara, Google Classroom) and supplemental support programs (Math Navigate, Khan Academy, No Red Ink)
- College and Career Pathways

Michael Merrick, Literacy Coach spoke on College and Career Pathways regarding:

- Early College Pathway program materials
- Pathways aligned electives, extracurricular activities and college classes
- Sequence of Pathway Intro Activities
- Partnership with iMentor
- College Real Talks Family Event with speakers aligned to pathways
- Updated senior portfolio project with coaching

Omar Pedia, Program Manager for iMentor gave information regarding what iMentor does:

- 3year program model
- Starts in the Junior year
- Have access to college graduate mentor and a professional in their profession
- Every student is match up with their mentor with work with the students through our Junior, Sophomore, and Senior year
- Once a week online working component in English class
- Once a month the mentor come to the site to visit with their students

Question and answer:

- Gary Yee asked, how do you define the addition of Pathway? Pathway right now is a pre-major to explore; by the end of 12th grade year, the students will understand what career or college they want, said Principal Cortez.

- What is different around school culture comparing to the past years? Asked Lacy Asbill Adamari - More parent involvement

Alexis - More students that are participating

- Do you feel that adults are more open to listening to students? Asked Lacy Asbill Alexis – Teachers asking student what is needed

Adamari - The relationship between the students and teachers are stronger

- Why is there a high percentage of students in STEAM? Asked David Kakishiba Ms. Cortez answered the question by stating:

Have a teacher that is a veteran

Hands on ability to engaged students in projects

Something about application in learning in those classes that is fascinating

- In building out a pathways, with the students that are struggling or less engaged, is there any impact on their level of engagement or interest? Asked David Kakishiba Can't control the engagement and the content in college classes, said Ms. Cortez
- To what extent does literacy and curriculum support the pathway work? Asked David Kakishiba

The literacy piece now is that the student have to read well, by knowing where the student read, the students could improve. The literacy piece was a big lift this year and it is up and running, got the routines and adjusted to make sure that there is clear non-negotiables and accountabilities in that, and next year can concentrate on priority 2 and 3, which are the curriculum pieces and the pathways, said Ms. Cortez

- Is there a baseline data in terms of first year persistent that is statistically that could be shared? Asked Gary Yee

John Fanny is the one that tracks that information for the schools, but it is not as strong as the school wanted to be, said Ms. Cortez

David Kakishiba asked, by adopting the design path with Engineering and Digital Media strains are the pathways to begin the implementation this school year? Dr Taylor said, the plan is for next year's 9th graders to take a engineer and a design class, and by the end of 9th grade they will decide with path to take.

Do you anticipate that 2 years from now when the Commission come back, would there be any noticeable changes in different subject matter teacher's looking at how to align the content? asked Gary Yee.

Yes, there will be more student engagement and they will be able to articulate more because of being in a pathway, said Jill Johnson.
