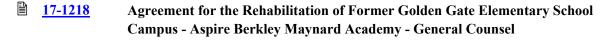

So, if we agree to these applications and the charter schools received the funding, then we are agreeing that they are entitled to that facility for the duration and right now we have a one or two contracts that are like 20 years or with Lazear with 40 years, but that is the exception. In general, most of the charter schools that are on our facilities are there for a year or three years. If our circumstances change and we want to grow a school or relocate one school community from one facility to another, we have the option to do that. I am not comfortable at all with turning over our facilities with perpetuity.
