Preston Thomas, Executive Director College and Career Readiness asked:

Can you share the thinking on how building out a pathway that integrates the core academics with the clear and coherence sequence around career courses to make it college and career?

Just received the ability to run the AP Capstone Program through the College Board and the purpose of the AP Capstone program is the ability as a school to offer two unique AP Capstone courses. The goal behind the two courses is to focus on students doing authentic group projects, individual research and design culminating in a final research capstone within oral defense said, Devin Croupman, Head of School.

In terms of workplace based learning piece, part of it is about 9th grader not all of them are ready for work based learning experiences. Getting ready to scaffold up the depth of the internships that the students are doing and one piece of that is looking at linking courses that are offered during intersession with the specific pathways in the theme and track that is one, said Nicole Newmiller, Intersession Manager.

Preston Thomas, Executive Director College and Career Readiness asked the school to share what the findings were from the survey and how is it impacting the programmatic decision that the school is making?

Through the survey a number of things that were learned. Parents are really invested in the idea of doing internships and trying to figure out how to connect 14 year old 9th graders with year long internships said, Devin Croupman, Head of School.

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Explain the reasoning behind having 11th and 12th grade classes be connected with the Community College rather than having teachers and what is the funding going to be used for if the school is using the Community College system to offer that to early college and middle college model?

The funding is going towards to make sure that the college courses actually live on campus, said Mitch Zoelzer, Assistant Principal. There will be online or hybrid courses that the school have contact with professors and students will then have space and structure, because online learning can get a little messy, especially hoping that student does it at home.
