With 2017-2018 ending the year with a 1% reserve, the budget reductions and increased revenues proposed for 2018-2019 adds \$8M to the Ending Fund Balance increases the reserve to 2.5%.

A proposed \$3.6M reduction will result in the 2.5% reserve to be met. Reductions options will be define at the June 27th Board Meeting.

Multi-Year Projection Assumptions and Next Steps, Cautions Ahead - Marcus Battle

• LCFF is fully funded in 2018-2019

• Cost of Living Adjustments (COLAs) are not expected to keep pace with the true cost of living

• Average Daily Attendance (ADA) continues to decline which results in reduced revenues.

• Support to Special Education, Early Childhood, Transportation and Child Nutrition need realigning to closely stay within each program's revenue sources

• Structural Deficit – ongoing revenues do not exceed ongoing expenses at this time

• Structural Deficit for Future Years - will increase as revenues are reduced and corresponding reductions to expenditures are not made

• Reserve Balance must be maintained and monitored to meet both the State requirement of 2% as well as the Board requirement of 3%

Director Gonzales talked about multiple reductions for 2018/2019 budget reductions.

District has departments in central office that other school district do not have; reductions at school sites is not the only way to solve the District problems; administrative salaries for 2018/2019, and grant funding

Director Torres also had questions about grant funding for 2018/2019.

President Eng commented on the projected decreased contribution to Food Services Department, grants aligned to long term policy, and multi-year projections.

Student Director Quetzal talked about the amount per pupil the District plans to cut from school sites.

Director Harris talked about the timetable for the reductions.

Additional Board Member Comments Director Gonzales said she is concerned about the enrollment projection of 441 fewer students for the 2018/2019 School Year.

Christopher Learned, State Trustee, addressed the Board on the 2018/2019 Budget. Learned comments included:

- After adoption of the 2017/2018, the Board had to make mid-year cuts
- 2018/2019 staffing issues is why FCMAT was critical of the District

• The additional \$12 million from the State is in the budget. District needs to identify one-time expenses because the \$12 million is one time funding. The District received \$5 million in 2017/2018 that was used for ongoing expenses.

Agrees a 2.5% Reserve is good.

• After the Governor signs State Budget, District can revise its 2018/2019 Budget 45 day later
