Progress report by staff on identifying and vetting budget reductions to Special Committee on Fiscal Vitality.

Marcus Battle, Chief Business Officer, made an update on the budget reduction process and shared:

- Looked at best practices

- Framing the budget reduction process around the District's mission, goals, Core Values, Strategic Priorities

- Review process is currently going through varies state of internal review – Being presented to Core Advisor Team and DBAC for review and input – It will come to the Special Committee on Fiscal Vitality on October 4th for final review and comment

- Will be a transparent process on how budget reduction will be identify, vetted and prioritized

- Process will allowed for full impacts of any staffing reduction, recommendations to be known with regarding to cost savings and any programmatic operational other impacts

- All recommendations will be scored against identify criteria and any final list of recommendations will be prioritized and presented for community and Board review

Will be a timeline for community engagement and feedback

- Process will encompass all possibilities to address the budget deficit including increasing in revenues, increasing in enrollment, decreasing spending and implementing cost savings initiatives

- One of the objectives of the budget reduction process right now that is public stated is there is a \$30 million deficit – The actual number that will be present at the October 4th meeting is somewhere in the neighborhood of \$40 and \$45 million because there will be tradeoffs – things that may not exactly give the District what is needed in terms of savings, so being able to go above and beyond identify reductions will give some room to address any shortfalls

- The plan is to have a recommended list by the end of October

After the presentation by Mr. Battle a comments were made on:
