Director Hinton Hodge introduced the item on the floor. Hinton Hodge talked about the lack of quality schools for all students in Oakland. There have been several conversations about how to improve our schools that included charter schools and small schools. Hinton Hodge said the Policy is an equity

measure about bringing up the standards and making sure every child has what they want.

Changes to BP 5116.1 Open Enrollment:

Opportunity Ticket Priority: Previously, prioritization in the enrollment process was limited to siblings and neighborhood residents. There was an absence in prioritization for families impacted by closing schools and schools where families will need to move to a new location. The Opportunity Ticket gives these families enrollment priority in selecting a new school that they deem suitable for their children.

Charles Wilson, Executive Director, Enrollment Office, made the staff presentation. Wilson said the Opportunity Ticket is a community-based initiative. The Opportunity Ticket is a chance to extend opportunities for families who have not had access to the top schools in the District due to socioeconomics and/or racial segregation. Wilson said in the City-Wide Plan, there will be some school closures, mergers and moves to give families a chance to access those schools better. He said the District should use this initiative as an opportunity to move toward integration in the City. He noted Oakland is the 11th most segregated city in California.

Board Member Comments

Director Harris supports the Amendment. He said this is an opportunity to address segregation in the District.

Director Yee said he supports neighborhood quality schools. However, some social networks provide access to high performing schools. Those networks have created a bias in the District's Open Enrollment Policy. Yee said the Opportunity Ticket levels the playing field, especially for those who may be displaced by school closures.

Director Hinton Hodge talked about students being displaced at West Oakland Middle School although the school is not a high performing school.

Director Torres commented on the Opportunity Ticket shifting the culture at a school, Principal's involvement, resources needed, and loss of ADA.

Director Gonzales talked about the need for an impact analysis on the implementation of the Opportunity Ticket.

Vice President London supports the Amendment. London talked about how long the District will provide transportation for Roots students. She also talked about schools that will receive students via the Opportunity Ticket having a voice represented in the process.

President Eng talked about the students impacted by a merger or being displaced due to the Opportunity Ticket.
