21-2676 Chief Governance Officer's Letter of November 13, 2021 to California Superintendent of Public Instruction Regarding ACSOS Letter of November 8, 2021

President Gonzales stated that the tonight she will be going over a couple of documents: one is the letter of financial concern the District received from Karen Monroe, Alameda County Superintendent of Schools (ACSS) (attached). Gonzales, summarizing, stated Monroe's letter expressed concerned about the lack of reduction in staff given the District's continued decline in Student Enrollment and the health benefits costs liability not yet accounted for (HBGB); the District's foregoing AB 840 \$10 million dollars, with strings; failure of District to reduce schools; and the District's reliance on one time COVID-19 dollars for on-going costs. Monroe, stated Gonzales, is concerned about District's multi-year projections and the lack of implementation, with fidelity, of Board voted cost reductions.

Gonzales stated one strategy of the County appears to be is to employ a more intrusive oversight including fore baring the payment of the salaries of the Superintendent and of members of the Governing Board; to assign additional county fiscal oversight staff to the District. and the assignment of a Fiscal Crisis Management Assistance Team (FCMAT) Review Team to the District, which compels the District to follow the Team's direction.

Gonzales noted that the District has already had a review by a FCMAT Team and implemented its recommendations. She also noted the Board held a Special Meeting last weekend responding to the County Superintendent's letter by appealing her finding to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction (SSPI)..

Gonzales stated that the gist of the District's response to the Monroe's letter is that it is too soon to make an assessment on any of the items; that the District is in the process of responding to the items in Monroe's letter and

that the District has already approved a cut \$6 million and will be making additional cuts over the next couple of months. Gonzales stated that this Report is being shared with the public for transparency and to inform Public what is going on [regarding issue between District and County Office of Education]. .

Gonzales noted that the District expects by Tuesday of next week a response to its appeal of Monroe's letter from SSPI Thurman.

Gonzales, in opening the President's Report, to her colleagues, received, among others, the following response:

Director Mike Hutchinson stated, in his opinion, that President Gonzales had put a "very kind framing" on the letter received from ACSS Monroe..He said it was very important for everyone in the community what Monroe's letter means for the District.. He said the letter is an attempt to reimpose oversight of the District by FCMAT. through their recommendations. He said the way that he "reads" Monroe's letter that their is an added threat that if this Board and Superintendent don't cooperate compensation will be held. He said this [threat] is after District has been working with the County and at the same time that ACSS Monroe has approved the District's current year budget. He said Monroe's actions seems punitive and appears to be her response to the Board not closing schools going forward. He said its what some in the community have been working [against] since the 2003 state take over. He said the decisions is now in SSPI Thurman's Court: Is he going to back local control and the a Board's decision to make decisions for "ourselves.?" Or is he going to back Monroe's punitive attacks on the District?

Hutchinson urged everyone in the Community to reach out and contact Thurman, who has the sole authority to make the decision.

He said that of all of the issues that have been brought up tonight - from students, staff, issues from McClymonds High - the thing that has to be understood that the root cause [of current issues] is the state takeover of 2003: State came in, broke District .and installed FCMAT as the decision maker. He said that he would not let that happen again, as this is the fight. He urged everyone to contact SSPI Thurman. He also urged everyone to attend the December Board Meeting when the District will know the response from SSPI Thurman,

Hutchinson said, lastly, to his colleagues, that he already had started putting out information on social media; that he is going to reaching out to local elected officials, urged colleagues to join him, and even, if one does not, the Board need to be able to retain the authority to make decisions for the Community.

Gonzales, having asked if other colleagues, Superintendent and/or Chief Governance Officer had comments, received no additional comments.


