Title: Ratification by the Board of Education of a Professional Services Contract between District and Crystal Charity, Oakland, CA, for the latter to provide 231 hours of direct on-site services regarding the student Conflict Resolution Program by collaborating with site staff to identify, recruit 5-10 peer mediators (11-14 years old) that reflect the racial, ethnic, and academic diversity of the school; provide the students with training in the mediation process, effective communications, problem solving restorative practices; teach peer mediators how to work in pairs to help peers involved in a dispute to resolve differences and repair relationships; and coach the peer mediators to conduct an average of 20-35 conflict mediations, and support the school site in creating a safe and healthy and supportive school environment for students through the framework of restorative practices at Elmhurst Community Preparatory School, for the period of October 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013, in an amount not to exceed \$5,775.00.
