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Oakland Tech Girls Hoops Team Receives Championship Rings











Enrollment Projections vs Actual

There is significant variance in the first week of school.

- Families are still enrolling their children online and in person.
- Families are leaving the area based on the cost of living in Oakland, but some families are also moving to Oakland from more expensive areas as well.
- Families may be holding seats in both charter schools/private schools and OUSD schools
- There are families on the waitlist for other schools and may not have shown up to the assigned school
- Many schools are not staffed to manage enrollment during the summer months.










Absence Rate (8/8-8/15)
