


**Grant Award Notification (continued)**

The following conditions apply:

1. The grant award will be processed upon receipt of the signed Grant Award Notification (AO-400). This AO-400 must be signed by the superintendent or an authorized official and **returned within 10 working days**.
2. All approved program funds must be expended within the dates designated and for the maximum amount indicated on the AO-400. Encumbrances may be made at any time after the beginning date of the grant stated on the AO-400. **No extensions of this grant will be allowed.**
3. The California Partnership Academies (CPAs) **supplemental grantee** is required to only use these funds to support attendance at the 2023 CPA Educating for Careers Conference, professional development activities, Moving the Needle 2.0 Professional Development, information technology items, and equipment for the operation and maintenance of the CPA at the high school noted in the AO-400 in accordance with the provisions of California *Education Code (EC)* sections 54690-54699. These funds are instructional in nature. These funds may not be used for out-of-state travel expenses.
4. These funds may not supplant current fixed costs. Expenditures shall comply with all applicable provisions for federal, state, and local rules, regulations, and policies relating to the administration and accounting for public school funds but not limited to the *EC*.
5. The grantee must limit administrative indirect costs to the rate approved by the California Department of Education (CDE) for the applicable fiscal year in which the funds are spent.
6. Upon receipt of the required certifications, scheduled payments of grant funds will be as follows:
  - The first payment, 90 percent of the funds, will be released upon completion and return of the AO-400. Please allow approximately four weeks for processing.
  - The final payment will be processed after receipt and approval of the End-of-Project (EOP) Expenditure Report. The EOP report should include a narrative of expenditures. The EOP report is due after all funds have been expended but no later than 30 days after the end of the grant period. Failure to submit a final EOP Expenditure Report with a detailed narrative within 45 days from the end of the grant period will result in a billing from the CDE for the entire amount of any grant funds paid and possible reduction of any subsequent years' grants.
7. At least three key staff members from each CPA are required to attend the Educating for Careers Conference to be held **February 26-28, 2023**, at the SAFE Credit Union Convention Center in Sacramento. These funds can be used for that purpose.

If the grantee terminates its participation in the program, the grantee shall submit a final expenditure report within 30 days and return the unexpended funds upon receipt of a billing from the CDE. Supplies and equipment purchased with these funds will be redirected to other CPA sites.
