During the 22-23 SY, we were unable to hire a Family & Community Partnership Coordinator (.5 FTE) that could directly support our Middle School students. The position was posted for more than 6 months but was unable to find a viable candidate. GSP did not utilize the allocated stipends for additional MS electives, as our MS Art teacher abruptly left during semester 2. Lastly, we only purchased 25 Rosetta Stone licenses to support our MS world language programming and did not utilize all funds allocated.

Fortunately, this year, with the carryover funds, we are able to hire an Art teacher to support ALL of middle school throughout the 6-8th grade during S2. Providing Art to all MS students creates opportunities of continuity and collaboration between the MS Art & HS Art teachers.


