1. Music Program

G1 funds in 22-23 were focused on the position and some basic funds. These funds help establish the very basic needs for the course.

This will also increase student success in the course and community engagement in our music program. 2. Art Program

Previous G1 funds were used to fund the art elective teacher position and provide the most basic materials needed to launch the class. We now have a better understanding of what is needed for the class to be successful.

\$12,000	The classroom has been slightly modified to support collaboration and art projects, but students are hampered by the limited space on the current round tables and regular sized tables to actively engage. Additionally storage of student materials and products is limited, and prevents students from developing longer, more complex projects. Lastly, additional supplies are needed to enhance the curricular opportunities offered in the arts course.	Increase in student pass rates in their Arts Elective.
	Currently, the art elective has the highest rate of Ds and Fs during the 1st marking period. We believe that this has to do with the learning environment and the students' need for additional organization and space to complete assignments.	

5. Safe and Positive School Culture

Programmatic Narrative Based on Data Analysis

Much of last year's expenditures were focused on school clubs and the African American family committee. Clubs were not established due to staffing challenges and the school took a more inclusive approach to outreach and engagement with AA families.

The goal of this work would be to develop SEL and/or restorative justice peer leaders to facilitate conversation among students for low level conflicts or other culture related issues. This group would meet during Advisory to practice and learn these important skills. We hope to establish a peer mediation practice as a recurring structure for student leaders at Greenleaf.		

\$10,000	Field day and end of year celebration for the middle grades	We expect to see an increase in student report "connectedness" as measured by CHKS.
	At the end of the year we will host a field day that will intentionally support students to model and practice our values, have fun through community based competition, and to provide a space for students and families and staff to come together. We find that there is less parent engagement with students in the upper grades and hope that this activity will bring more parents into the community and help us to build relationships across roles. We also believe that these events give us a chance to experience joy together, which can be healthing and restorative for everyone.

	Greenleaf has planned a series of school field trips that include visiting museums, attending art and music performances, and visiting regional parks to engage in community building and science investigations. The following is a sample of the field trips that we have planned for this year: DeYoung, Exploratorium, SFMOMA, Fort Funston, Oakland Ballet, and Mount Tam. The funds will be used to secure transportation for all students.	surveys.
