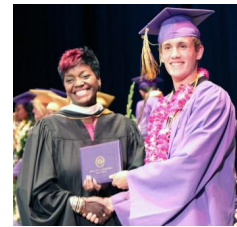

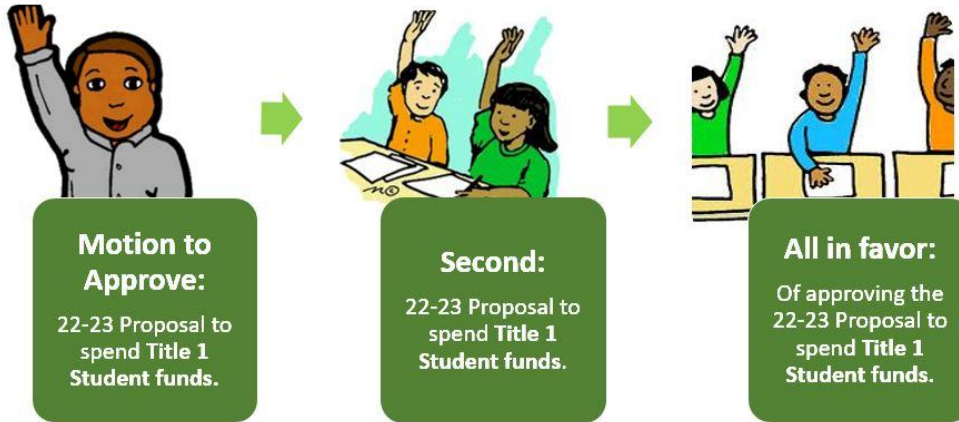

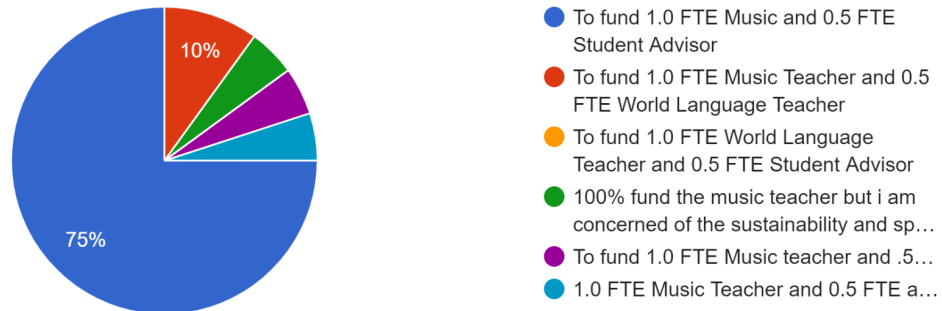

It would be great to give students more choice for electives.

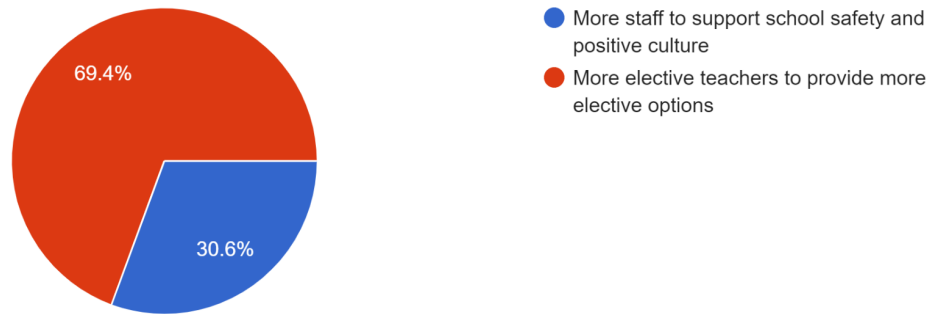

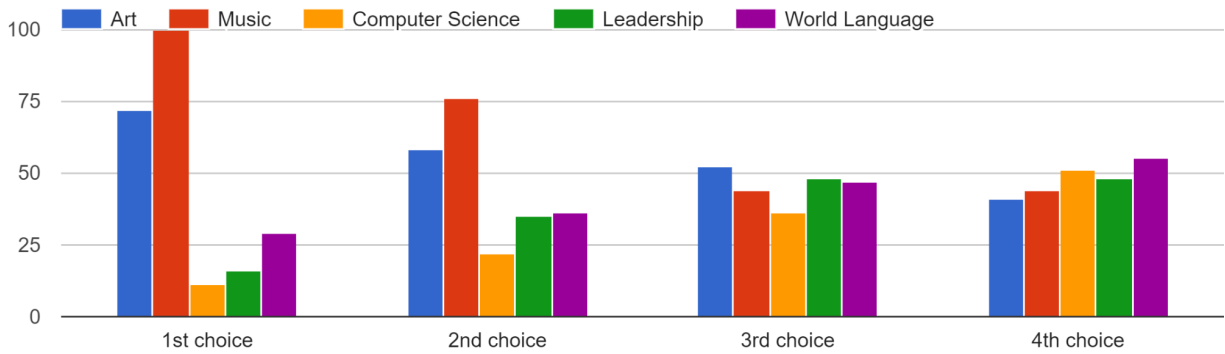
I think music is very important to our electives program at UPA, and the Student Advisor role makes a contribution to our Culture Team.

Expectations around Staff/Student Boundaries

Hello,

One of the many things that make our school so special is the positive relationships we build with students and the individualized support we provide. However, it is important that we all understand and follow professional boundaries about how and when we communicate with students during and outside of school hours. We have a responsibility to teach students what these healthy boundaries look like in order to model for them the boundaries they should have with other adults. In addition, we should all understand that crossing these boundaries may be perceived by others as grooming behavior intending to lead to sexual abuse, which can lead to employment and criminal consequences. This is particularly important for our male-identifying staff members to be aware of as 95% of student sexual harassment/abuse complaints against an adult at school involve a male-identifying adult.

- * Staff members should never be alone with a student in a classroom or office with a door closed unless your role requires you to do so (counselor, therapist, social worker). If you are alone with a student for any reason, make sure the door is propped open and stay in plain sight.
- * Staff members should not be communicating with students via text or social media outside of school hours without clear permission from the student's family.
- * All communication with students outside of school should be about school-related information and activities.
- * Staff members should not be meeting with students outside of school hours without clear verbal or written permission of their parent or guardian.
- * Maintain physical boundaries. Adult-initiated hugs, pinches, side hugs, tickles, etc... are all inappropriate. Respect the physical boundaries of children like you do for adult co-workers.

If a student starts to cross these boundaries, for example excessively texting or wanting to talk on the phone in the evening, please remind them of professional boundaries and offer ways you or other staff can support them during the school day. If students seem to not have physical boundaries for themselves when interacting with adults, we still have a responsibility to remind them of appropriate boundaries with touch and space.
