Additionally, there were impacts of COVID on the supply chain material shortages. Furthermore, Cole was changed from a fully built-out 2-storey building with a separate Multipurpose building on the site to a 2-storey building with the 1st floor remaining as shell space. This resulted in revisions to the egress/exiting requirements and the addition of a 3rd stairwell. Also, the Community requested that the Basketball court that was previously a mainstay of the site and frequently in use be replaced. Finally, there were updates to the building code requirements, OUSD standards, installation of future Solar conduits, building vandalism, and scope added by the City of Oakland, along with changes required by PG&E and EBMUD that resulted in additional unforeseen costs.

Recommendation

Approval of the Cole Administrative Center Budget Increase of \$5 Million, May 22, 2024. This budget increase allows the project to be completed while incorporating additional scope mandated by the City of Oakland and absorbing the additional costs for soil remediation, extended schedule, and pandemic related escalation.

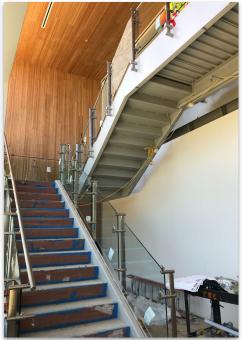

- Includes Project Contingency to avoid additional changes





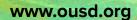
