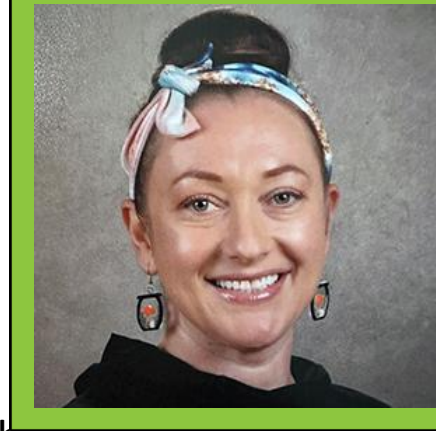

Jazmine Njissang



8th Grade Math Teacher, West Oakland Middle School

- “Ms. Njissang goes above and beyond to build strong relationships with her students while also creating an inclusive, collaborative classroom culture. She will also often be a sounding board when students are struggling with social-emotional needs.” (Rosa Aguirre-Alexander, Instructional Coach, WOMS)
- “She spends hours poring over the curriculum, adjusting it to fit her students’ learning styles and differentiated needs, creating lessons that are engaging from ‘bell to bell.’ She emphasizes the importance of group work and collaboration from the first day and asks her students to problem solve with each other multiple times throughout a single class period. Over time, she strategically removes certain scaffolds and help students lean into ‘productive struggle’ with mathematics.”
