Big Picture Overview Measure G

What is Measure G?

"Measure G" is a Parcel Tax collected by the City of Oakland in the amount of \$195 per parcel. Measure G is a permanent parcel tax effective July 1, 2009.

The Purposes of Measure G:

- Maintain school libraries
- Provide programs, including arts and music, that enhance student achievement
- Attract and retain highly qualified teachers
- Maintain courses that help students qualify for college
- Maintain up-to-date textbooks and instructional materials
- Keep class sizes small
- Continue after-school academic programs









Big Picture Overview Measure G

When does Measure G Expire?

Measure G does not expire. In order for Measure G to end, there would have to be a measure on the ballot calling for an end date to the measure.

What is the Annual Measure G Budget?

The annual Measure G Budget is roughly \$20,611,890. Theoretically, it should continue to increase as the number of parcels increases - new housing, etc. However, the Annual Budget has stayed very consistent these past 5 years.

Measure G has a Committee that provides oversight

Monthly on the Third Monday of the Month. Currently there are 7 members on the commission. Three members (a quorum) are required to hold the meeting.

2024-25 Budget By Program

EEIP: Covered Elementary Intervention Period.

Provides Elementary Sites with Prep Teachers to teach PE, Art, Music, etc, while **Providing Classroom** Teachers with a Prep Time.

Measure G Library 2024-2025

Allocation: \$5.8 Million (Increase from \$5.4 Million in 2023-24)

- 53.7 total FTE. Forty-one (41) sites receiving 1.0 Librarian or Library Tech. Fifteen sites receiving 0.5 Librarian or Library Tech.
- Oversight on Spending is Done in Collaboration with Strategic Resource Planning and Academic Department.
- 90% + of Schools Sites have Hired Library Techs or Librarians this Year;
 - Still aiming for 100%
 - Increase from Less than 50% of Schools Having Libraries Four Years Ago









EEIP Teacher Prep Elementary 2024-2025

Allocation: \$4.66 Million (Decrease from \$5.03 Million in 2023-24)

- Total of 33.8 FTE
- Elementary Sites receive a .05 FTE Prep for each class that they have, including SDC classes.

EXAMPLES:

- A site of 20 classrooms receives a 1.0 EEIP/Prep teacher (20 x .05 FTE=1.0 FTE)
- A Site of 12 classrooms receives an EEIP prep teacher allocation of .6 FTE (12 x .05 FTE)













2024-25 Music and Art Programs

Music - Instruments and Choir: Allocation for \$4.8 Million

- All Elementary schools now have music in grades 4-5, and expanding to K-5 VAPA classes for all elementary sites
- Middle Schools and High Schools fund through electives, G1, and other funding.

The Arts - Visual and Performing: Allocation: \$915,000

- 2023-24: 24 Sites Funded for Art Programs
- Hiring a VAPA Art TSA for the District

Oakland Fine Arts Summer School (OFASS): \$220,000

 Provides Middle and High Schoolers with Summer Fine Arts Programs











OAL Middle and High School Sports 2024-2025

Allocation: \$3.06 Million (Increase from \$2.67 Million in 2023-24)

- Middle and High School Sports
 - Covers Buses, Referees
 - Covers Coaches and Staff Stipends, Supervision required for weekend and night games
 - Covers 5 FTE
 - 1 Commissioner
 - 2 Program FTE: Director and Manager
 - 2 Clerical Support: Student Engagement, Scheduling etc.









Recruitment and Retention 2024-25

Allocation: \$868,336: Talent Determines Positions and Budget

- Pays for 2 Full Time TSA's to provide extensive "New Teacher Support" and teacher training, including a "Teacher Boot Camp" with role playing, lesson planning, observations, etc.
- Pays for 2 Full Time Staff to provide support for struggling teachers, including teachers referred to Peer Assistance Review.
- Pays .5 FTE admin staff member to support recruitment and retention work.












