FloWater Update

FloWater Installation: As of 10/1/24 = 167

60 Flowater Systems arrived in OUSD at the week of the last Board meeting and we have begun installing them at the schools with the highest needs.

52 additional Flowater systems installed in schools with identified need.

Over 4,700 refillable water bottles will be provided to schools that identify need and have been distributed to schools

7,200 reserve water bottles on order if schools have a water bottle filling station issues that require maintenance.

Order of Installation:

1. Prioritizing schools that have only 1 Flowater system with no backup water bottle filling systems.
2. Prioritizing Schools with a high % of water sources with results over 5 ppb.
3. Prioritizing schools with higher relative enrollment to Flowater systems with a ratio that is higher than 200 students per Flowater system.
4. If all factors are equal, we will use LCFF rate to install at site.



District Highlights

Hundreds of Students Turn Out for OUSD's Annual College Night

Oakland High hosted hundreds of students and their families for OUSD College Night on September 25.

Attendees got to meet representatives from the University of California (UC) system, the California State University (CSU) system, community colleges, private schools, and Historically Black Colleges and Universities to learn about post secondary options. They could also gain information about scholarships and other financial aid.

There will be another college event at Fremont High on November 2 for all students. This event is new to Northern California and will be just for the CSU system, and will include all CSU schools.
