## **District Highlights**

#### District Holds Inaugural OUSD → CSU College Day

On Saturday, November 2, students of all ages from across the District came to Fremont High School, to take part in the District's first ever  $OUSD \rightarrow CSU$  College Day. This was the first time that the California State University (CSU) system has collaborated on such a college fair in Northern California with only CSU schools present. This event include all 23 CSU schools such as Cal State East Bay, Chico State, and San Diego State.

Hundreds of students from every grade from early childhood education to high school seniors, and their families, got to talk to representatives from each CSU school, and learn about their programs, campuses, and campus life. Additionally, they attended workshops on the CSU application process, financial aid, and hear from current students from various CSU campuses.






#### **Literacy PD Fosters Learning From Fellow Educators**

Investing in our educators is a core focus area of our literacy work. We continue to build out a robust system of support and coaching, as well as increasing the time educators have for professional development (PD), peer observation, collaboration and planning.

Since last school year, several OUSD school leaders have attended the EL Education Leaders Institute to strengthen implementation of EL Curriculum. EL Education (formerly known as Expeditionary Learning) is a model that emphasizes high achievement through active learning, character growth, and teamwork.

Other OUSD leaders visited Conway Academy near San Diego, an EL Education certified school with student demographics similar to those at many OUSD schools.

As such, our leaders were able to learn from fellow educators how EL Education can accelerate literacy through high-quality student work and student ownership of their learning.

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#### **16th New Playground Installed on an OUSD Campus**

**Esperanza Elementary** and **Korematsu Discovery Academy** - which share the Stonehurst Campus recently held a playground build with the Eat. Learn. Play. Foundation and KABOOM!, with support from Workday, Ripple, and more wonderful partners.

This is the 16th new playground in OUSD schools installed through the partnership with Eat. Learn. Play. and its founders, the Curry Family.

### **Best Practices & Areas of Improvement**

#### **Best Practices**

- Teacher education to build collective responsibility, about the importance of attendance.
- Positive and consistent family engagement.
- Teacher collective efficacy: teams that work together and set each other up for success by doing whatever needs to get done for kids.
- Defining and teaching "good attendance" to students.
- positive and engaging school culture that engage and re engage students around attendance and school connectedness.

#### Areas of Improvement

- Teams not having solid expectations for meeting structures and protocols, which leads to inconsistency in meetings and monitoring student data.
- Working in silos can have a negative impact. Ex: not thinking about the ways that schools culture and climate impacts attendance.
- Deficit mindset about students can negatively impact the work of teams to positively and pro-actively create cultures of inclusion and belonging.

### All Elementary Sites: Morning Absence Notice

- 1. ParentSquare Attendance Alert for elementary students.
- 2. Mid morning message goes to parents of absent students, daily at 10:00am.
- Message asks parents to bring students to school if they are not ill.

- Alert to ensure students are in school progressing educationally and OUSD receiving more ADA funding.
- Data to be reviewed in first quarter to see if more students are attending school after receiving notice.

## Water Quality Update

## **School Water Quality Update**

- All fixtures that tested at or below the District's limit of 5 parts per billion (ppb) are in service.
- All fixtures that show elevated levels are taken out of service.
- Our teams are fixing problematic outlets before retesting the water.
- Once tests show the water meets the District standard, the outlets are returned to service.
- All outlets now in service have a sticker that looks similar to the image to the right.
- We will continue testing outlets at remaining OUSD schools over the next six weeks.
- We have installed 60 additional <u>FloWater machines</u> in schools, and we are planning to install 88 more this year.
- We are developing a dashboard that will go live soon, allowing everyone to see how many filtered water systems there are at every school.



#### **Testing Data Analysis & Understanding**

We have created a **Water Quality Action Team** that meets on a weekly basis to track and monitor progress on installations and address any challenges and concerns. The team is currently working on a key for everyone to use to look at each school's testing results document and better understand all the included terms and abbreviations.

We will continue sending regular updates to the entire District, as we make progress. We will also contact individual schools when their water outlets are being tested, results are in, fixes need to be installed, and problems are resolved.
