Subject: **Measures N and H Recommendations for 2023-2024 Carryover Funds**
Date: November 5, 2024

OVERVIEW & OBJECTIVE

Sixteen OUSD district schools, ten charter schools, and the Measures N and H Administrative 10% **have unspent** Measures N and H funds from the 2023-2024 fiscal year. Of these 27 sites, 9 submitted their 2023-2024 Measures N and H Carryover Plans at the November 5, 2024 Measures N and H Commission meeting. These plans articulate the context that contributed to the carryover, **the amount and percentage of Measures N and H funds being carried over,** and a clear budget for the carryover funds.

Per Measures N and H Commission policy, approval from the Measures N and H Commission is required for all Carryover Plans. Measures N and H staff have reviewed the submitted 2023-2024 Measures N and H Carryover Plans and provided feedback to the school sites, which was addressed before submission to the Measures N and H Commission.

<p>Classified Support Salaries: Hire a College and Career Readiness Specialist, at 1.0 FTE, effective term from January through June 30, 2025.</p> <p>The College and Career Readiness Specialist is designed to support students in aligning their pathway learning with opportunities outside of school, including summer programs and other enrichment opportunities. Specifically, CCPA would like to support students in using their base in design thinking, makerspace, and engineering in exploring related programming in the trades. Additionally, we will continue to align our work with other computer science education programs through tech companies. Our goal is to have all students engaged in their learning and see a through line to a future job or educational opportunity that they are excited about pursuing. Our goal is to have all students engaged in their learning including internship and dual enrollment and seeing a through line to a future job or educational opportunity they are excited about pursuing. <p>Consultant Contract with the Oakland Public Ed Fund to facilitate and pay-out the Exploring College, Career, and Community Options (ECCCO) 2025 Summer Internship Program for CCPA students, through June 30, 2025.</p> <p>OPEF will serve as out Fiscal Sponsor to process and pay-out all of the internship stipends. ECCCO will provide the opportunity for students to experience college and career options. The stipends for students are paid through the Oakland Public Ed Fund, but the program is administered by the High School Linked Learning Office. Internships provide pathway students the opportunity to apply their problem solving and project management skills in a real environment with real problems. This deepens their learning and value for their skills. Additionally, internships build students motivation to grow into the field they are interning within.</p> <p>Budget: stipend amount varies by student participation. Approximately \$500-\$850 per student.</p> <p><i>OPEF can only invoice schools for student stipends with 100% participation and completion and the admin fees for those funds. OPEF can not invoice for the full contract amount prior to the program ending. <p>Teacher Salaries Stipends: Extended Contracts to pay teachers for participating in academic support and credit recovery options to maximize student progress towards graduation, through June 30, 2025.</p> <p>Participation includes intersession, post-session, summer school, responsive intervention, dual enrollment, ECCCO Internship, and mastery assignment completion, only through June 30, 2025. This serves all high school students at CCPA grades 9-12 approximately 500 students.</p> <p>Budget: The number of hours and teachers is hard to predict because summer school is paid per diem, and the hours will vary depending on the need of amount of credit recovery to be done, the numbers fluctuate every year.</p> <p>After accounting for benefit costs at 30%, the available amount to use towards this expenditure is not to exceed \$63,822.16.</p> <p>Of that amount we will process \$5,000.00 stipends for teachers for the semester, 2-3 teachers per grade as needed for the above mentioned purposes.
