History of the Palace Theater

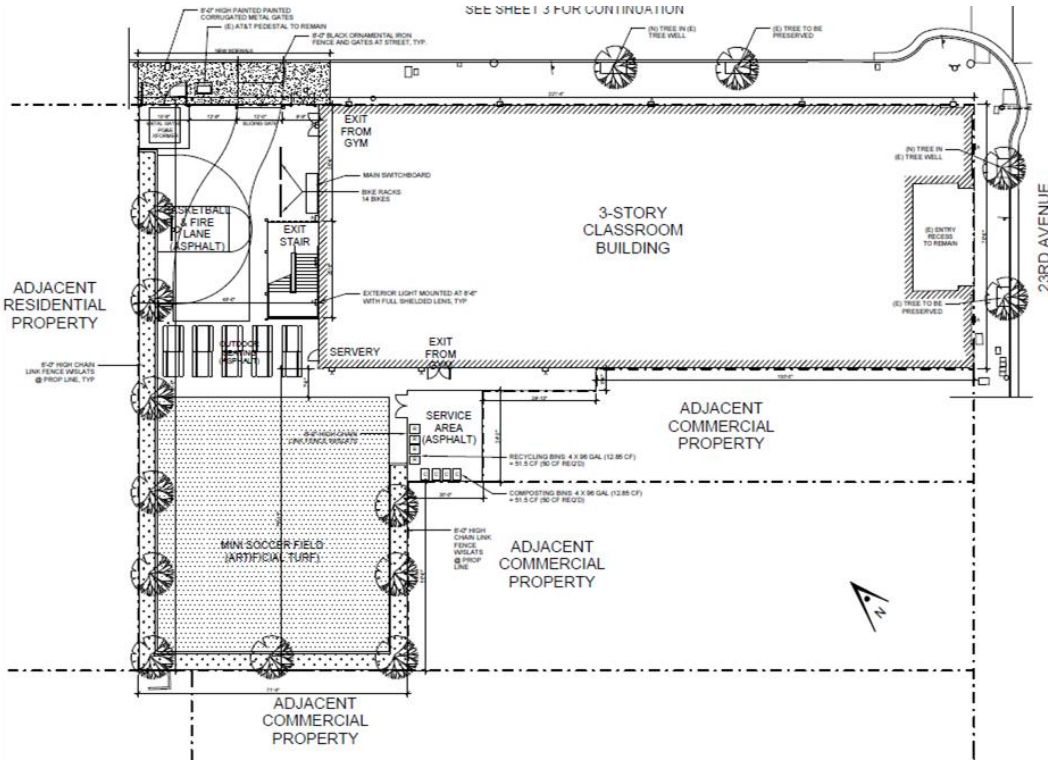


Construction: Originally constructed in the 1920s as a vaudeville theater, the Palace Theater transitioned into a movie theatre in the 1930s and then a church space in the 1950s.



Community Significance: The building has an Oakland Cultural Heritage Survey (OCHS) rating of B*2+ , indicating it is a contributor to the 23rd Avenue Commercial Area of Secondary Importance with a historic rating that could improve with restoration. While the building is not currently listed on the National or California Registers of Historic Places and Historical Resources, it is considered eligible for the California Register, and therefore would be considered a historical resource for the purposes of CEQA. The building is considered eligible for listing as a good example of a neighborhood theater designed in the early 1920s in a Spanish Colonial Revival style, as well as for its association with master architects, the Reid Brothers, who designed a renovation to the building in 1931.

Palace Theater Project Plan

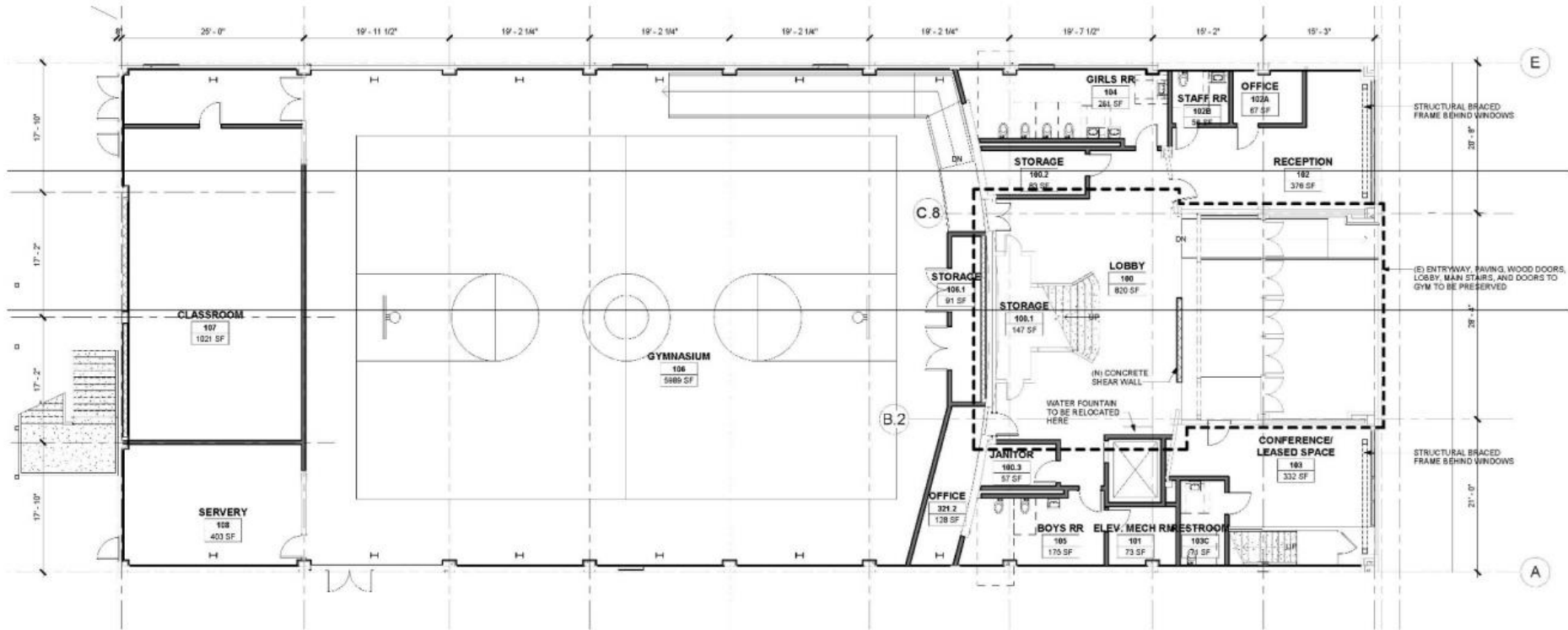


The property location (Census Tract 06001405901) qualifies as “severely distressed” for NMTC purposes. Specifically, the tract’s poverty rate is 32.4% and tract income as % of AMI is 31.9%. In 2023-2024, Bay Tech’s student population is 83.7% FRL which is higher than the OUSD 2023-2024 rate of 77.1%

Bay Tech is currently the owner of the property with construction having commenced in Summer 2023. The building is scheduled for a completion date in Fall 2025.

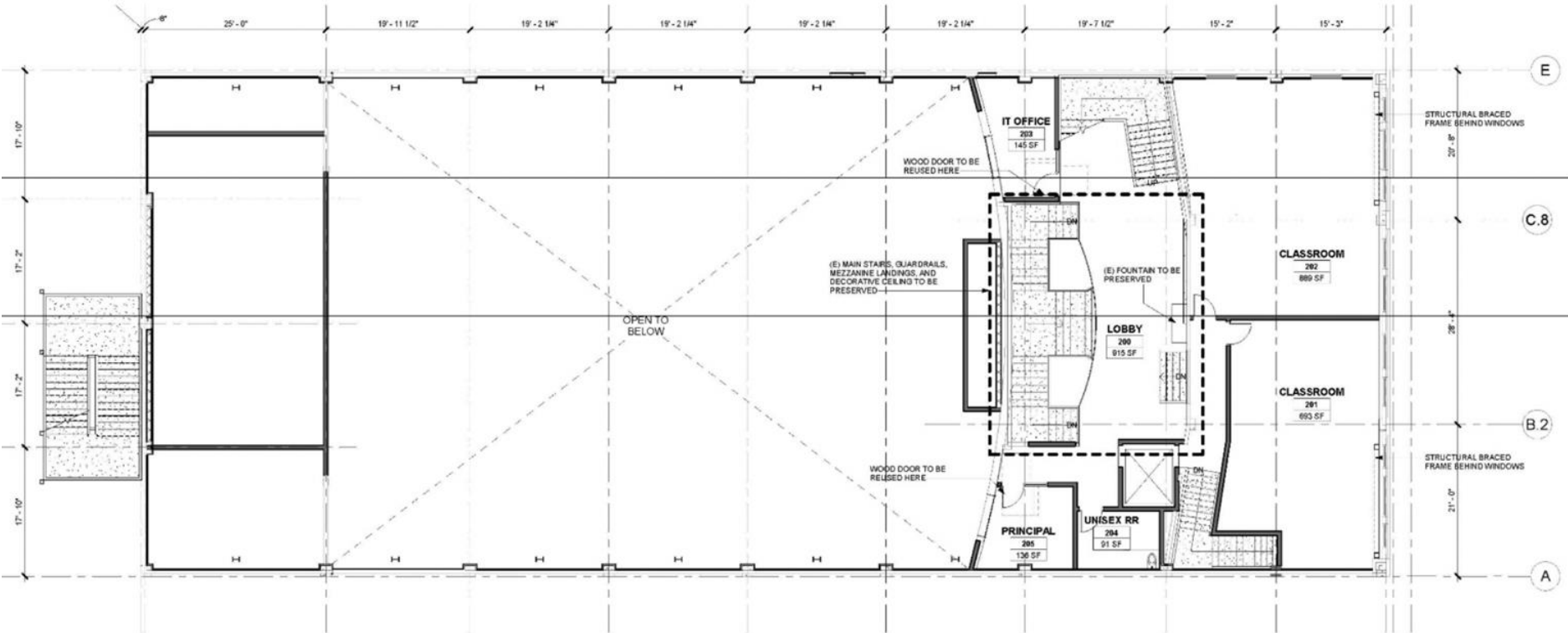


Palace Theater Project Plan



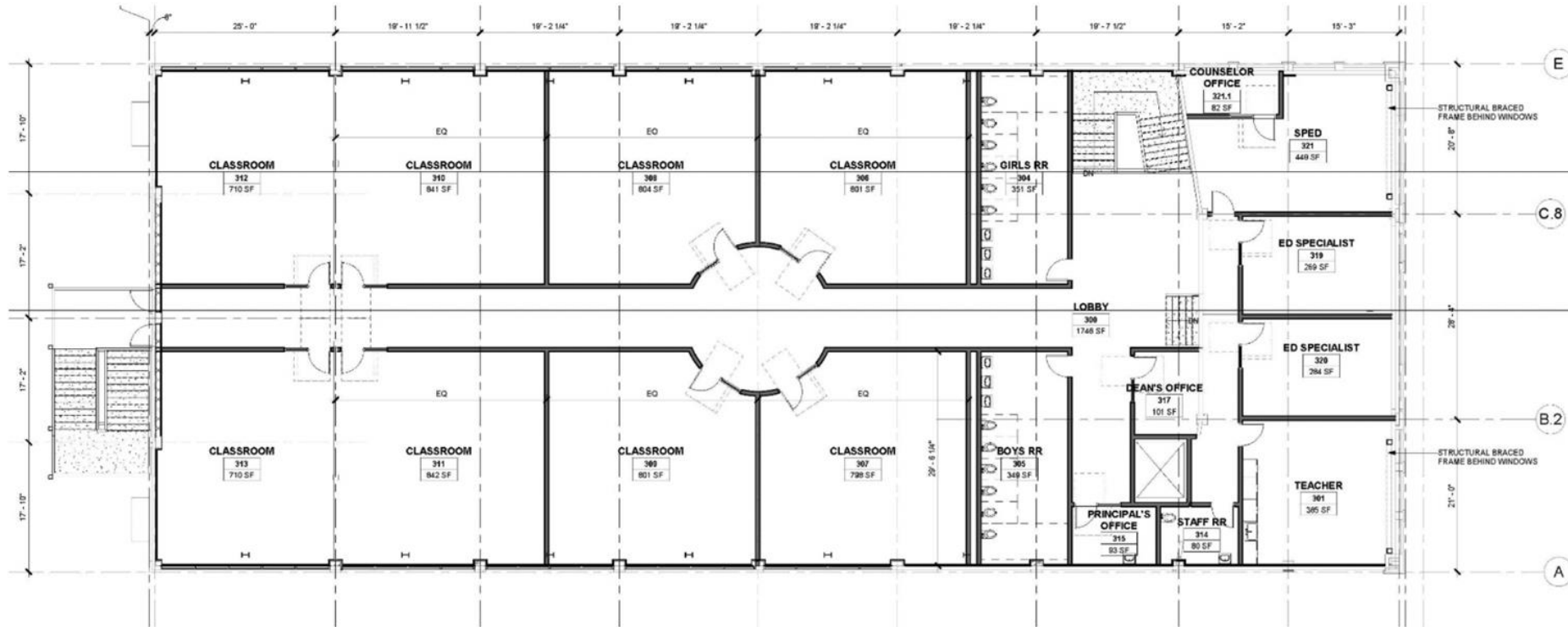
First Floor

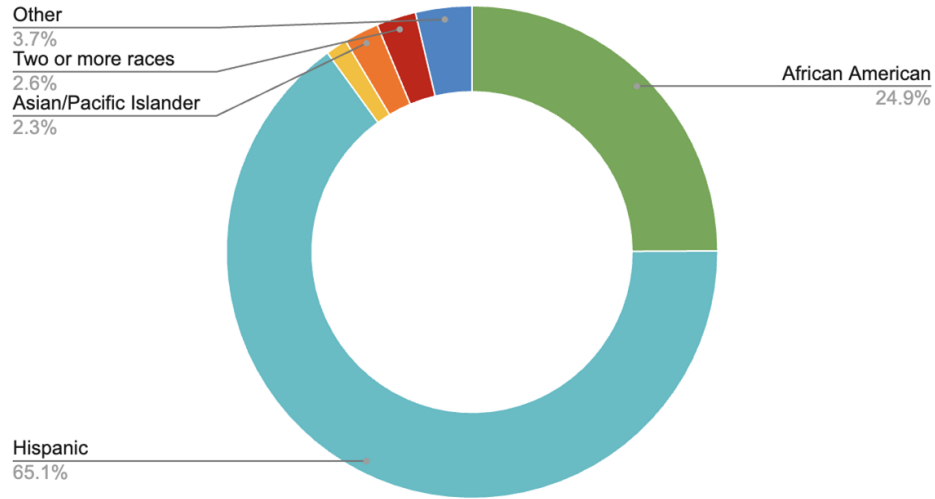

BayTech vs OUSD Student Population



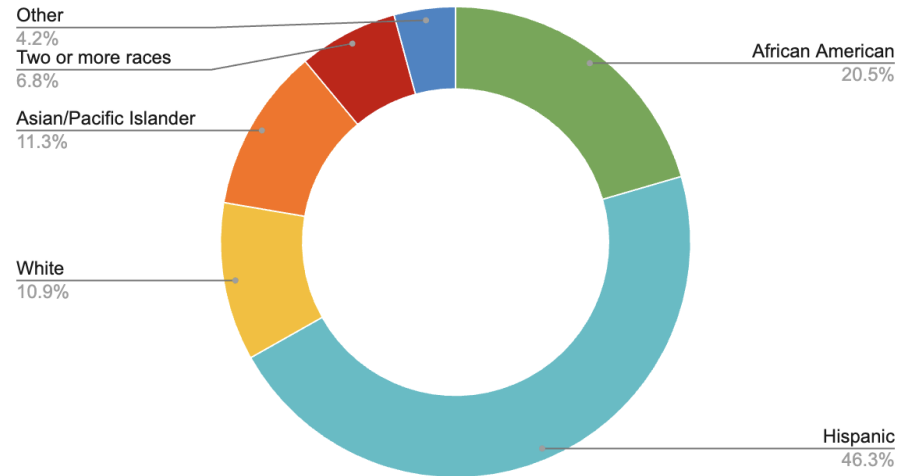

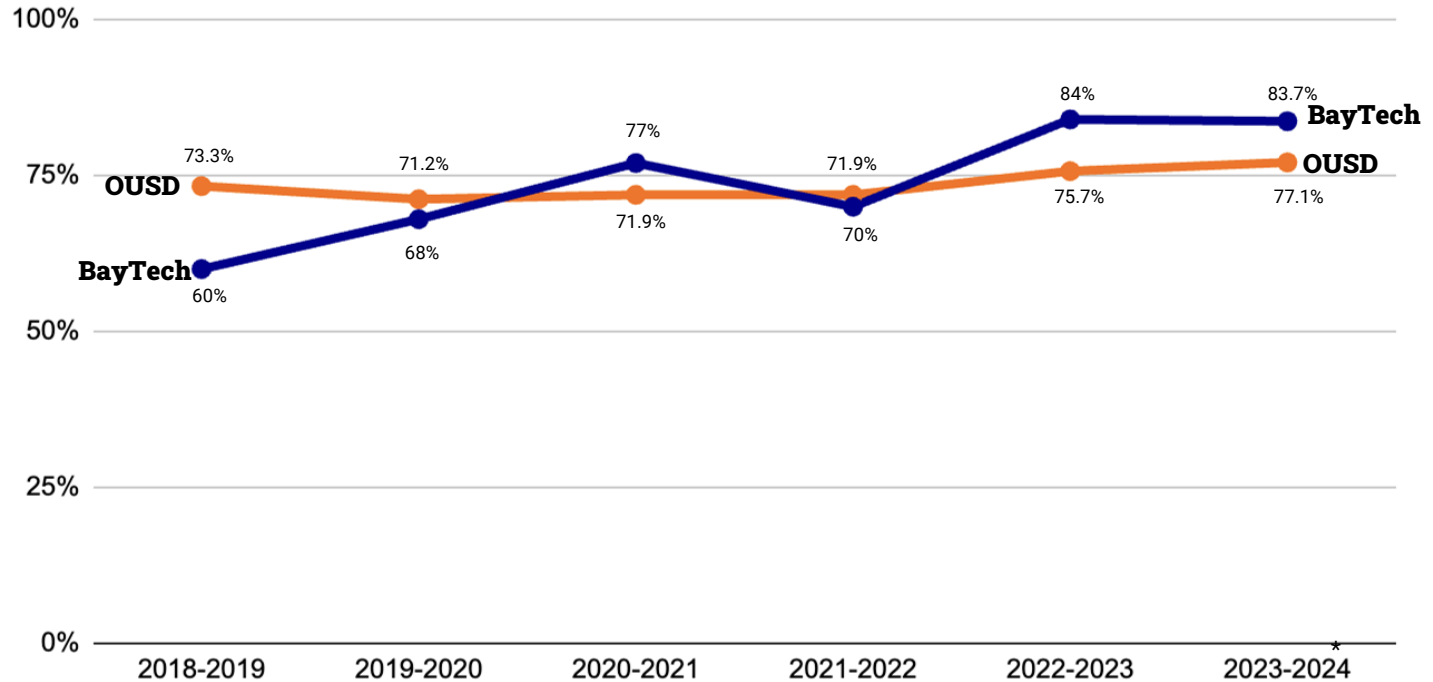


BayTech vs OUSD Student Population



Socio-Economically Disadvantaged Student Population

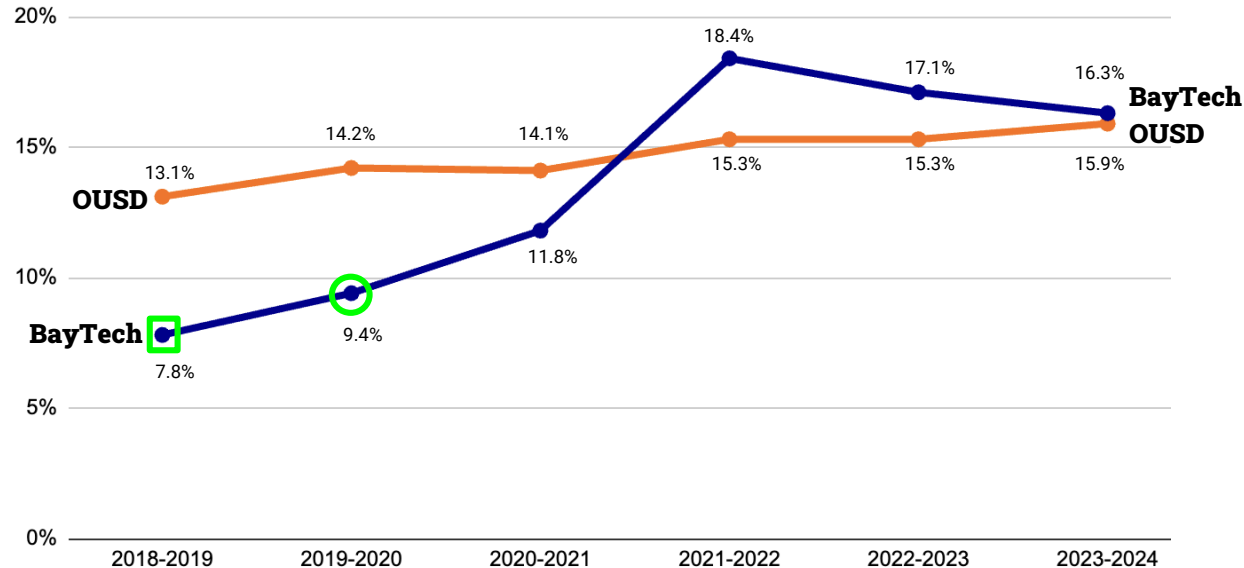

Special Education Population



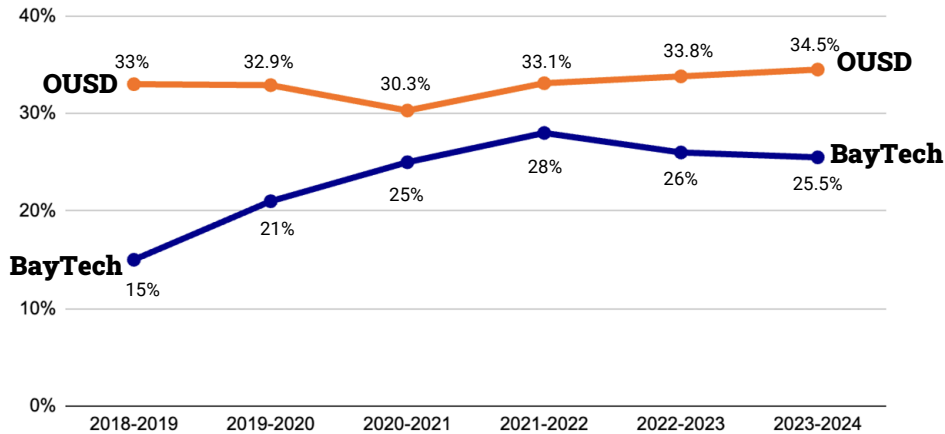

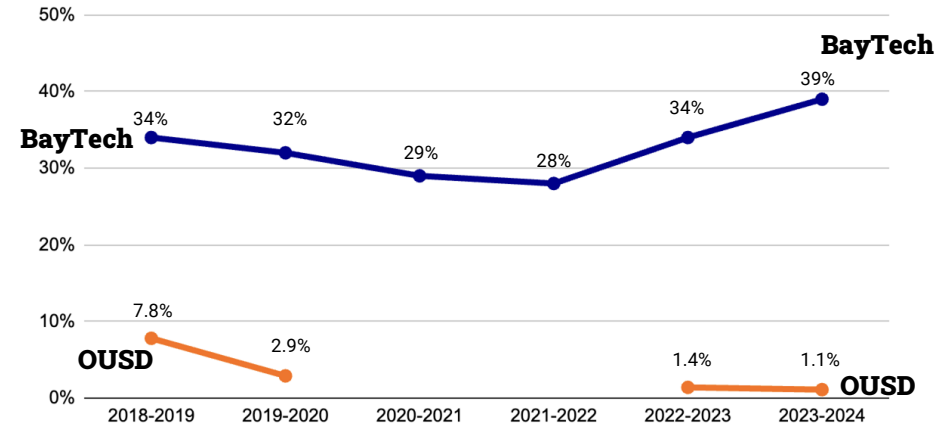
BayTech vs OUSD Student Population

ELD Redesignation Rate

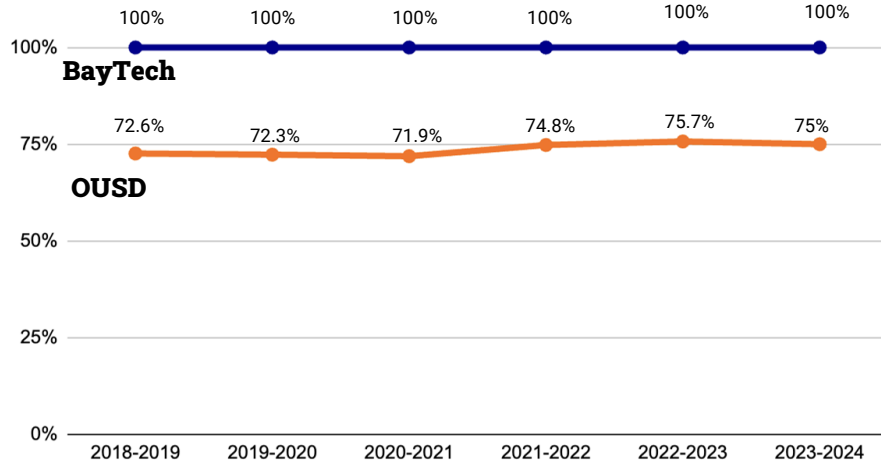

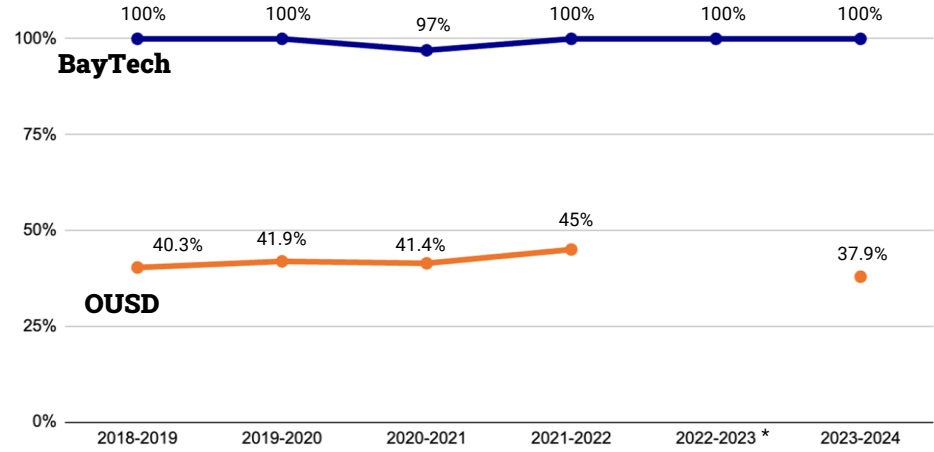
