

No on AB 68

- AB 68 is a proposed California Law requiring at least one armed cop on public school campuses
- Why Oppose? This criminalizes students who are Black, Brown, and Disabled
 - Increases arrests and suspensions
- Waste in funding: AB 68 funds cops instead of counselors and student programs
- Ways to support:
 - Sign the letter in opposition
 - Contacting your assembly member
 - Spread the word!



What is California Assembly Bill 68

AB 68 is a proposed California law requiring at least one armed cop on every public school campus. Studies show this disproportionately impacts Black and Latine youth, LGBTQ students, students with disabilities, and undocumented youth, often making them feel unprotected.

Data shows More Cops = More Stops

According to **California Data***, among youth ages 12-14,

- 72.9 percent Black youth police stops were for reasonable suspicion
- 64.0 percent of Latine(x) youth police stops were for reasonable suspicion
- Only 51.4 percent of the white youth police stops were for reasonable suspicion

More police means more targeting of Black and Brown kids.

Why We Oppose AB 68

Criminalizes Students: Police target Black, Brown, and disabled students, increasing arrests and expulsions.

Doesn't Improve Safety: Police don't prevent violence—mental health support works best.

Wastes Funds: AB 68 funds cops instead of counselors and student programs.

What We Need Instead

More Support, Not Cops: Hire counselors, social workers, and specialists to address conflicts.

Restorative Justice Works: Peer mediation and conflict resolution improve school climate

No Policing, Stop criminalizing our students
