**Progress on Administering
the English Language
Proficiency Assessments
of California (ELPAC)**

ELPAC is the **E**nglish **L**earner **P**roficiency **A**ssessment for **C**alifornia

The ELPAC is a state required English exam that determines how well ELLs can read, write, listen, and speak in English.

All districts and schools receiving federal money are required by law to test every ELL each year until they reclassify.

Reading



Writing

Why the ELPAC is important

ELPAC score is the most important criteria used for reclassification, an ELL's "language graduation"

Students' scores between years help determine where students are making progress and where interventions are needed

Data inform decisions around instruction and programming at school and district levels

Enrollment for ESY (SPED) begins on March 10th

TK-8 Summer enrollment for our district-run programs begins on March 17th for TK-8 students.

TK-8 Families receive will receive an invite via Email and Text, and will complete registration using our Enrollwise tool

High School students needing to recover credit will work with their school counselor who will recommend them for summer school if needed.

Extended School Year

Extended School Year 2025

Extended School Year (ESY) services are primarily designed for students with moderate to extensive support needs. These students may experience significant regression in their skills over a long school break and struggle to regain them once classes resume.

Generally, ESY is not intended for students in resource or mild/moderate programs because these students often benefit more from general education summer intervention programs that allow them to continue their learning with general education peers.

ESY Dates

Elementary and Middle School: 5 weeks

PreK, High School, and YAP: 4 weeks

ESY Enrollment

- Enrollment is through EnrollWise.
- You will receive a text or email based on your chosen preference.
- Enrollment begins March 10 and occurs on a rolling basis.
- Speech-only students will not receive an invitation. They will be contacted directly by a Speech Therapist (SLP).
- You will only receive 1 application, so identify if you are interested in attending other programs such as Springboard or EL program. If you prefer the Gen Ed program, contact your school immediately.
- Summer counseling can be offered for those who are in the General Education credit recovery program.

ESY Transportation

If you have transportation in your IEP, **April 25th is the deadline** to complete enrollment to get transportation.

How do you apply for transportation?

There is a checkbox on the ESY application.



EL Authorization for Teachers and Instructional Aides

The EL Authorization

California statute requires that every teacher who provides instructional services to an English Learner be authorized to provide specialized instruction for those learners.

This instruction would either:

- 1) help learners to understand instruction that is taught only in English,
- 2) help learners develop their ability to listen, speak, read, and write in English,
- 3) be provided in the learners' primary language as English is acquired
- 4) be taught in a language other than English for those learners in a dual immersion program.
