Descriptions of VAPA programs

Visual and Performing Arts Disciplines

The state of California defines 5 VAPA disciplines or artforms:

- Dance
- Drama
- Media Arts
- Music
- Visual Art
- *Career Technical Education - Arts Media Entertainment*
(primarily high school pathway courses)

Schools may select from any of these VAPA disciplines to meet the fine arts course of study.

Elementary VAPA is provided through 3 primary sources...

Required

- 1. All Schools receive an allocation for VAPA based on enrollment** sufficient for each student to receive 50 minutes of VAPA instruction from a certificated teacher.

Optional

- 1. EEIP positions may also be used for VAPA,** Schools choose how these positions are used. (PE, Science, Literacy, VAPA, etc.)
- 2. Site funds:** Additional site funds may be used for VAPA including AMS-Prop 28, PTA, grants, other discretionary funds. (AMS must be used for VAPA)



Secondary VAPA Programs

- **All schools have VAPA programs**
- Staffing allocations are made based on enrollment. Electives are included in the allocation formula.
- OUSD graduation and UC/CSU admissions require: 1 year of VAPA
- Generally, the larger the school, the more VAPA choices
- **Schools determine the courses within the VAPA program that work best for their community.**






Arts and Music In Schools Legislation

- Calculated at 1% of Prop 98 funds
- Approximately \$6Mil/year (~ \$125 per student average) additional funding for Title 1 students
- **At least 80% must be used** for personnel (Classified or Certificated)
- Up to 19% can be used for materials, equipment, PD, and contracted services (up to 1% can be used for administrative costs).
- Funds are to **supplement not supplant** existing programs
- School based decisions. **Schools determine** how AMS funds will be used to expand VAPA programs.


OUSD Arts Spending (Without Prop 28)

Elementary VAPA is provided through 3 primary sources...

Required

1. **Baseline:** All schools are allocated staffing sufficient to provide all students TK-5 with at least 50 minutes of VAPA instruction per week. **Schools choose the VAPA discipline(s) that works best for their community.** (Funded by Measure G. AMS is in addition to this baseline.)

Optional

1. **EEIP positions:** Additionally, all schools are provided an EEIP position sufficient to provide 50 minutes of instruction per week. This position can be for any content (PE, Science, Literacy, VAPA, etc.) Some schools use this position for VAPA to provide additional access to VAPA classes.
2. **Site funds:** AMS-Prop 28*, PTA, Categorical, Grants, and other discretionary funding. Schools can use additional resources to add to their VAPA programs through additional staffing or contracted services.

*AMS must be spent on VAPA.

Arts and Music In Schools (AMS) - Prop 28

PROPOSITION 28 - ARTS AND MUSIC IN SCHOOLS




- Calculated at 1% of Prop 98 funds (LCFF) added to LCFF for arts education.
 - Approximately \$6Mil/year (~ \$125 per student average)
 - Distributed with a double share for Title 1 Students
 - Funds are allocated **directly to schools**
- **At least 80% must be used** for personnel (Classified or Certificated)
- Up to 19% can be used for materials, equipment, PD, and contracted services
- Up to 1% can be used for administrative costs.
- Funds are to **supplement not supplant** existing programs
- **Allowable VAPA disciplines:** Music, Visual Art, Dance, Drama, Media Arts, and CTE-AME pathway courses.
- School based decisions. **Schools determine** how AMS funds will be used to expand VAPA programs.

AMS-PROP 28 Funding Timeline

- AMS-PROP 28 funding has a three year spending cycle.
- OUSD budgets for and expends AMS-PROP 28 funds during years 2 and 3 of the funding cycle.
- Given that funds are estimated in July and confirmed in December for year 1, we are unable to include Year 1 AMS funds in the site budgeting process.
- Funds are distributed in the spring but budgeted and spent in the subsequent two years. The expenditure and FTE data presented in this report pertains to the initial funding cycle (Cycle 1, covering the 2023-2024 disbursement). The allocation for the current cycle (Cycle 2, 2024-2025) is budgeted for expenditure during the 2025-2026 school year and will be included in next year's AMS report.




AMS-PROP 28 Impact

(with Prop 28 as of April 17th)




