**Discussion** This serves as an opportunity for this charter school to check-in with the Board about successes and growth areas in preparation for the 2025-26 renewal timeline.






# STUDENT DATA

ACA demonstrated double-digit growth on CAASPP in both ELA (11.97% to 24.30%) & Math (13.68% to 27.53%) from 2023 to 2024

Based upon the California Dashboard, ACA exhibited overall growth across all academic indicators (ELA, Math, & ELPI)

Out of 12 comparative TK-5 schools within 1.89 miles or less of ACA, ACA outgrew them all in both ELA & Math based upon DFS change. ACA had an overall DFS change of 31.4 in ELA, compared to the next best school at 16.9. In Math, ACA had a DFS change of 28.4 which was also tops amongst comparative schools




## 2024 CAASP Distance From Standard



Bay Area-ACA



## Strategic Approach


- **Tier 1:** Integrated ELD - Visual/Video Aids, Realia/Manipulatives, Intentional Groupings for Pair-Sharing/Cooperative Learning, Sentence Stems Frames
- **Tier 2:** Designated ELD - EL Achieve Curriculum
- **Tier 3:** Additional Small Group Intervention during the school day and in after school program

With these supports, we are hoping to increase English Learner progress by over 20% this year.

- Among ELs the biggest improvement was at **Fruitvale** (81.5), **AIMS** (38.9) and **Aspire College Academy** (29.5).
- Significant improvements in EL progress were seen at **Aspire College Academy**, which increased by 22.5 percentage points, **Aspire Golden State**, which improved by 21.8 percentage points, and **Montera Middle**, which improved by 21.7 percentage points.




