The third change was to allow the General Contractor, Overaa, to contract early with five of their vendors to purchase some building components early to minimize the expected impacts of tarriffs.
- Budget increase improved by the Board of Education.

- In April we will continue working with the state agencies to obtain approval to demolish the existing gymnasium.
- We will also start meeting with the Department of State Architecture to ensure the proposed design will be approved when submitted in October.

• The project is over budget at this time. The value engineering process will align scope and budget. Additional funds may be sought.

• We are working with the school site to schedule meetings for the end of the 2024/5 school year and at the start of the 2025/6 school year.







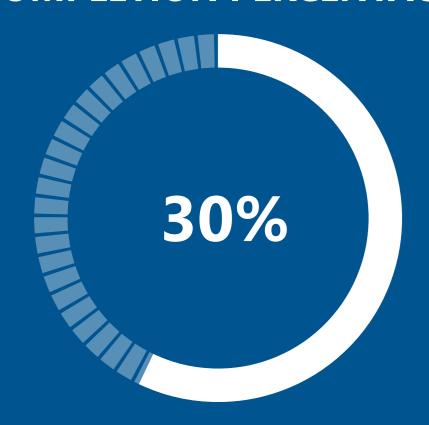
Fremont High School

The project involves the demolition of existing portable classroom buildings and the installation of new, single-story modular classroom buildings, designed for improved space utilization and flexibility in educational settings. Additionally the existing elevator system will be modernized to meet current building standards. The re-roofing scope encompasses the removal of the existing roofing materials and the installation of a new, energy-efficient roofing system designed to improve durability and performance. The existing parking lot will be renovated to improve drainage, pavement quality, and accessibility, incorporating ADA-compliant features.
