**We will also meet this Saturday from 9am to 3pm to set goals for this school year.**

**We are still focused on our initiatives and have additional groups and activities to work on them. The initiatives focus on:**

- **School stability for disabled students.** Policy to guarantee that all students with IEP can attend their school for the entire grade span like continuing General Education students do.
- **A more than 5% decrease in the suspension of Disabled Black students in Middle School.** These suspensions have only decreased by that much since 2020.
- **Full Access to Social-Emotional and Academic Supports for Disabled Students** [Current Areas of Focus: After-School, Visual-Performing Arts, Athletics, Work-Based/Linked Learning]
- **Equitable Access to Measure H Funding and Work & Career-Based Learning for Students in the Young Adult Program**
- **Follow-Up on the CAC Legislative Priorities Adopted by the Board in 2023**  
These focus on charter schools being accountable for serving all disabled students and on increased funding for supporting disabled students.  
**Sufficient Special Education Staffing for Disabled Students with IEPs.** This work is being undertaken in partnership with the Talent Division.

We would like to offer a full report to the School Board about progress in each of these initiatives and to be in formal dialogue with you about how to better promote them.

**We also engage in comprehensive review of the LCAP and the Local Plan for Special Education.**
