PSAC: Who We Are

We, the members of the LCAP PARENT AND STUDENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE, represent the families in all of the schools and educational programs of OUSD.

As parents and students, we center those who are most affected by the decisions made in our district.

We uphold the leadership of families as we promote **respect** for our work within school site and district committees.


We rely on our **connection to school committees** so that we can reflect the experiences and priorities of school communities.

Parent members of PSAC are elected by parent members from the *School Site Councils* and *Site English Language Learner Subcommittees* of schools in our electoral districts.

Student members are **elected by the student leaders** of All City Council.

Elections for membership in PSAC are held in September. Members serve for a minimum of two years.

Up to seven members are elected to serve as **Lead Delegates**. They are the officers who steer the work of the committee.



28 parent/guardian members (4 from each electoral district) and 9 student advisors

The District English Language Learners' Sub-Committee or DELLS

is a part of the LCAP Parent & Student Advisory Committee

13 of the 28 members of LCAP PSAC are also members of DELLS,1-2 from each of OUSD's 7 electoral districts.

When We Meet

PSAC has public meetings on the 3rd Wednesday of every month.

Because we gather SSC and SELLS members from across OUSD, we ask schools not to schedule their SSC and SELLS meetings on 3rd Wednesdays.

DELLS has public meetings on the <u>4th</u> <u>Thursday</u> of each month, with a few exceptions for holidays.

DELLS bring together all members of Site English Language Learner Subcommittees (SELLS) and all families of English Learner students.

We ask schools to make sure that their SELLS meetings do not conflict with DELLS meetings.

The Lead Delegates of PSAC commit to attend all planning meetings and report to the School Board. All members are invited to participate.

What Sets Us Apart as a Committee

- 1. We have a democratic and representative elections process that is organized by electoral districts like the school board.
- 2. Our elections process is linked to the elections process of school committees. The elections of school committees should also be democratic and representative.
- 3. We are member-led. We vote on our priorities, set our own agendas, and develop our presentations together.
- 4. We have student members with full voting rights and responsibilities.
- 5. We have strong relationships with other district advisory committees (liaisons across committees, joint goal-setting, reporting across committees; adopting each other's priorities, etc.)

- 6. We report to the School Board monthly.
- 7. We believe in courageous conversations and take them on. We are not afraid to discuss difficult topics with our community.
- 8. We are diverse. We represent many backgrounds and communities from across Oakland.
- 9. We made decision by consensus and not just majority voting.
- 10. We create open forums and discussions in our meetings. We work to build safe spaces.
- 11. We work to foster the participation of everyone (inclusive of language, race, disability, etc.)

The Basic Commitment of PSAC Members

The basic commitment as a member if elected:

- 1. Participate in the monthly meetings on 3rd Wednesdays.
 - 2. Review the agenda and information for each meeting.
- 3. Review the comments and suggestions made by committee members and families from schools in their electoral districts.

For example, each Spring we send surveys to SSC and SELLS members to learn about school priorities for services and investments.

4. As possible: promote parent, student, and community participation in PSAC meetings and activities.

The Elections Process of the LCAP Parent and Student Advisory Committee






HOW CAN I JOIN PSAC?

Parents and guardians who are members of their school's School Site Council or Site English Language Learners Subcommittee can become LCAP PSAC members.

Student members are selected by All City Council (the student leadership body of OUSD).

SSC and SELLS members participate in an annual election where they break up into electoral districts, accept nominations to membership in LCAP PSAC, and cast their votes.
