WestEd Subagreement: Terms and Conditions GENERAL PROVISIONS

1.0 Independent Status and Responsibilities

In performing its services, Subcontractor shall be an independent contractor with authority and responsibility to control and direct the performance of the services required under this Subagreement, subject to Subcontractor's general right to inspect work in progress to determine whether the services are being performed in accordance with this Subagreement. All persons hired and/or contracted by Subcontractor shall be Subcontractor's employees subcontractors. Subcontractor shall be responsible for the accuracy, completeness, and adequacy of all services performed by Subcontractor's employees and/or subcontractors and shall ensure that all applicable federal, state, and county licensing and operating requirements and all applicable accreditation and other standards of quality generally accepted in the field of Subcontractor's activities are complied with and satisfactorily met. Subcontractor voluntarily and knowingly assumes the entire liability (if any such liability is determined to exist) to its employees and/or subcontractors or to other persons for all loss, damage, or injury caused by Subcontractor's employees and/or subcontractors in the course of their employment and/or contract. Subcontractor shall be responsible for payment of applicable income, social security, and other federal, state, or county taxes and fees, and all statutory benefits including, without limitation, Workers' Compensation, Unemployment Insurance, and Temporary Disability Insurance.

2.0 Warranties

Subcontractor warrants that all services performed under this Subagreement shall be performed consistent with prevailing industry standards. If WestEd determines that Subcontractor has failed in the performance of this Subagreement, Subcontractor will be given fifteen (15) days to complete any required corrective action. If Subcontractor is unable to correct the performance issue, WestEd shall be entitled to terminate the Subagreement immediately at the conclusion of the fifteen (15) day period and to recover all fees paid to Subcontractor for the deficient services.

DATA PROPRIETARY RIGHTS AND PRIVACY, LEGAL PROTECTION, AND TERMINATION

3.0 Intellectual Property Ownership and Limited License to Use

- **3.1** WestEd is and will remain the sole and exclusive owner of any newly created data, documents, information, and other materials ("Work Product") developed by or for WestEd under this Subagreement, and of any pre-existing Work Product owned by WestEd that is accessed in the performance of this Subagreement or included in any Work Product that is provided by WestEd to Subcontractor under this Subagreement, including any and all intellectual property rights in such newly created and pre-existing Work Product.
- 3.2 Subcontractor agrees to convey, and hereby does convey and assign, to WestEd all right, title, and interest in and to any invention or discovery which is or may be patentable or otherwise protectable under Title 35 of the United States Code that was first conceived or first actually reduced to practice in the performance of the work under this Subagreement. Subcontractor agrees that any information, design, expression, computer program, or other work that is or may be copyrightable subject matter under Title 17

- of the United States Code first created or developed in the performance of the work under this Subagreement shall be a "work for hire," as defined by Title 17, Section 101, of the United States Code, for the benefit of WestEd such that WestEd is the author of such work for purposes of ownership and registration of the copyright. To the extent any such work might not be deemed a "work for hire" Subcontractor agrees to convey, and hereby does convey and assign, all right, title, and interest in and to the copyright in the work to WestEd. Subcontractor further agrees that any other information or data first created or developed by Subcontractor in the performance of work under this Subagreement, including that which may be subject to protection as a trade secret, shall be proprietary to WestEd. This provision will survive termination of this Subagreement.
- **3.3** All pre-existing WestEd data and materials provided to Subcontractor by WestEd to assist in the performance of this Subagreement shall remain WestEd's property. WestEd hereby authorizes Subcontractor to have access to and make use of the data and/or materials as is appropriate for the performance by Subcontractor of its obligations under the Subagreement. Subcontractor receives no authorization, permission, or license to use WestEd data and materials other than for Subcontractor's compliance with this Subagreement. Any such authorization, permission, or license automatically terminates with the expiration or termination of this Subagreement.
- **3.4** Upon expiration or termination of this Subagreement for any reason, Subcontractor shall promptly request instructions from WestEd regarding whether Subcontractor should: (a) Erase or destroy any pre-existing WestEd Work Product and/or newly developed Work Product created or maintained by Subcontractor; or (b) Return the pre-existing and/or newly developed Work Product to WestEd. Subcontractor shall promptly comply with WestEd's instructions. This provision shall survive termination of this Subagreement.

4.0 Confidential Information

- **4.1** If the parties have previously or concurrently entered into a Confidential Nondisclosure Agreement ("NDA"), that NDA is attached hereto as Exhibit ____ and incorporated herein by reference. If the parties have not entered into such NDA, the following provisions apply.
- **4.2** The party disclosing Confidential Information is the "Disclosing Party"; the party receiving the disclosed Confidential Information is the "Receiving Party."
- 4.3 "Confidential Information" shall mean and include, where appropriate and without limitation, all technical, financial, and business information of any kind whatsoever, such as, for example and not limitation, data, specifications, proposals research projections, processes, techniques, technology, ideas, know-how, improvements, inventions (whether or not patentable or copyrightable), trade secrets, formulae, information concerning research or development by or for the Disclosing Party, information which is or has been generated or received in confidence by or for the Disclosing Party by or from any person, and any other information as well as any and all tangible and intangible embodiments thereof of any kind whatsoever; in each case disclosed by the Disclosing Party to the Receiving Party, or obtained by the Receiving Party through observation or examination of the foregoing, regardless of whether such information or embodiment has been marked as confidential. Confidential Information shall include disclosures in any form,

whether in writing, in an electronic format (including without limitation emails, tapes, diskettes, compact disks, or other similar media), and orally (in the case of oral disclosures, only if such disclosure is identified as confidential prior to disclosure).

4.4 The confidentiality obligations of this Subagreement shall not apply to any information which (a) is already in the public domain through no breach of this Agreement; (b) was, as between the parties, lawfully in the Receiving Party's possession prior to receipt from the Disclosing Party; (c) is received by the Receiving Party independently from a third party free to disclose such information to the Receiving Party lawfully; or (d) is independently developed by the Receiving Party without reliance on Confidential Information or reliance on individuals who have had access to Confidential Information. It will be Receiving Party's burden to prove the existence of one of these exceptions by a preponderance of the evidence.

4.5 Confidential Information:

- (a) Shall not be copied, distributed, or disseminated in any way or form to any third parties by the Receiving Party without the prior written consent of the Disclosing Party, except as required by a valid legal process or a court or other lawful order; provided, however, that the Receiving Party shall first have given reasonable notice to the Disclosing Party and shall have provided reasonable assistance at the Disclosing Party's expense to contest or limit the scope of disclosure of Confidential Information pursuant to such legal process; and if disclosure is compelled, that such disclosure be pursuant to a suitable protective order;
- (b) Shall be maintained in confidence and may only be disclosed to those employees and agents of the Receiving Party or of its affiliates who have a need to know;
- (c) Shall not be used by the Receiving Party for any purpose, except as otherwise expressly stated in this Agreement, without the prior written consent of the Disclosing Party; and
- (d) Shall remain the property of the Disclosing Party and be either destroyed or returned to the Disclosing Party (along with all paper, electronic, or other copies thereof) within 30 days of the completion of the Subagreement, or within 30 days of receipt by the Receiving Party of a written request from the Disclosing Party setting forth the Confidential Information to be destroyed or returned. For any Confidential Information to be destroyed, the Receiving Party shall certify in writing to the Disclosing Party the destruction of any and all documents, papers and materials containing such Confidential Information, and notes thereon in the Receiving Party's possession, including paper, electronic, or other copies thereof.
- **4.6** The Receiving Party shall protect the confidentiality of Confidential Information through the exercise of the same degree of care, but no less than a reasonable degree of care, to prevent the unauthorized dissemination, duplication, use, or disclosure of the Confidential Information as the Receiving Party uses to protect its own confidential information of a like nature. If the Receiving Party discloses Confidential Information to any of its employees or agents, the Receiving Party shall inform such employees or agents of the restrictions under this Agreement on duplication, use, and disclosure to third parties and dissemination within its organization and shall take other actions necessary to maintain the confidence of such

Confidential Information (including executing agreements with employees that are materially similar to those set forth herein).

4.7 All provisions governing Confidential Information set forth above shall survive termination of this Subagreement and shall remain in effect for seven (7) years following the termination of this Subagreement, or from the last act performed by either party in furtherance of their obligations under this Subagreement, whichever occurs later.

5.0 Protection of Confidential Pupil Records and Information

- **5.1** This Subagreement potentially involves Subcontractor's possession of or access to confidential pupil records or information under the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) (20 U.S.C.A. §1232g), California Education Code section 49060 et seq., and any other applicable statute or regulation of any other State with jurisdiction over this Subagreement, whether provided by WestEd or by a local educational agency.
- 5.2 Subcontractor bears full responsibility for compliance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws concerning the confidentiality of pupil records or information, including but not limited to the following: (1) ensuring that the storage, maintenance, and transmission of all confidential pupil records or information, whether in electronic or paper form, uses the most secure form of data protection, encryption, and security to prevent breach unauthorized disclosure, or theft of data; (2) ensuring that confidential pupil records or information is only accessed by personnel necessary to carry out Subcontractor's obligations under this Subagreement; (3) entering into any necessary agreements with educational agencies for the possession, maintenance and use of confidential pupil records and information; (4) ensuring that Subcontractor's use of confidential pupil records or information complies with all statutory and/or contractual provisions regarding the permissible uses of such records or information; (5) providing any required notice to parents and/or guardians regarding Subcontractor's possession, storage, or use of confidential pupil records or information, including any unauthorized disclosure thereof; (6) complying with procedures for the return, disposal, or destruction of confidential pupil records or information upon the completion of Subcontractor's duties and obligations under this Subagreement; (7) procedures to ensure that confidential pupil records or information shall be aggregated or anonymized in such a manner so as to prevent the disclosure of Personally Identifiable Information as defined in 34 CFR § 99.3; and (8) any other measures that may be reasonably necessary to comply with all applicable laws governing pupil records or information. Subcontractor shall not disclose any confidential pupil records or information to any third party, subcontractor, or vendor, without the written consent of WestEd. In the event that Subcontractor discloses any confidential pupil records or information to any third party, subcontractor, or vendor as part of the performance of its obligations under this Agreement, it shall include Subcontractor's obligations under this Subagreement in any agreement with the third party, subcontractor, or vendor.
- **5.3** Nothing in this Subagreement shall be construed to give Subcontractor any propriety right, whether it be in copyright, trademark, patent, or otherwise, to any pupil records or information provided in connection with Subcontractor's performance of its obligations under this Subagreement.
- **5.4** The indemnification provision in this Subagreement shall apply to any and all actions, suits, claims, demands, losses, costs, penalties, obligations, errors, omissions, or liabilities made by any party in

connection with the alleged disclosure of confidential pupil records or information.

- **5.5** This paragraph shall be interpreted in conjunction with any other requirements applying to Subcontractor as contained in any prime contract, subcontract, or Request for Proposal (RFP) terms. Any such requirements that are more restrictive as to Subcontractor shall supersede those set forth in this Subagreement.
- **5.6** All provisions governing Confidential Pupil Records and Information set forth above shall survive termination of this Subagreement and shall remain in effect in perpetuity.

6.0 Data Repository

Upon request, Subcontractor shall provide copies of its deidentified project data to WestEd for purposes of archiving the deidentified project data, with a national data repository (e.g., ICPSR). The national data repository retains and manages the data for the purpose of making research and evaluation data accessible to authorized users for the purpose of scientific investigation, scholarship or teaching, or other forms of research and research development. If data are archived with a repository, the third-party repository manages long-term data storage and data archive access. All archived data will be deidentified so that the identities of subjects cannot be determined by a reasonable person. The third-party repository will restrict data access to verified scholars and researchers.

7.0 Indemnification

Subcontractor shall, to the fullest extent permitted by law, indemnify, defend, and hold harmless WestEd, its constituent entities, officers, directors, employees, attorneys, agents, representatives, volunteers, successors, and assigns (collectively hereinafter "WestEd") from and against any and all actions, suits, claims, demands, losses, costs, penalties, obligations, errors, omissions, or liabilities, including legal costs, attorney's fees, and expert witness fees, whether or not suit is actually filed, and/or any judgment rendered against WestEd, that may be asserted or claimed by any person, firm, or entity arising out of, or in connection with, Subcontractor's performance under this Agreement, or any acts, errors, negligence, omissions, or intentional acts by Subcontractor, its Governing Board, administrators, employees, agents, representatives, volunteers, successors, and assigns. This indemnity and hold harmless provision shall exclude actions brought by third persons against WestEd arising out of any acts, errors, negligence, omissions, or intentional acts by the WestEd or solely out of any acts or omissions of WestEd that are not otherwise related to or connected with Subcontractor. The party indemnified under this Section shall promptly give notice to the indemnifying party of the threatened or instituted claim along with a demand for defense and/or indemnity under this Section. This indemnification clause shall survive termination of this Subagreement.

8.0 Insurance

Without in any way limiting the Subcontractor's liability pursuant to Section 7.0 Indemnification of this Subagreement, Subcontractor shall procure and maintain during the full term of this Subagreement the following insurance amounts and coverage for services and work provided in this Subagreement:

(a) Comprehensive Commercial General Liability, with limits not less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence, \$2,000,000 aggregate combined Single Limit for Bodily Injury and

- Property Damage including coverage (or no exclusion) for sexual abuse and molestation;
- (b) Comprehensive or Business Automobile Liability Insurance with limits not less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence combined Single Limit for Bodily Injury and Property Damage, including coverage for Owned, Non-owned, and Hired Vehicles, as applicable;
- (c) Worker's Compensation Insurance, for statutory limits with Employer's Liability limits not less than \$1,000,000 each accident;
- (d) Umbrella or Excess Liability for limits not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$1,000,000 aggregate above general liability, auto liability and employer's liability;
- (e) Professional Liability (if applicable) for limits not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$3,000,000 aggregate;
- (f) Employment Practices Liability for limits not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence, \$2,000,000 aggregate;
- (g) Cyber Liability for limits not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence, \$2,000,000 aggregate; and
- (h) Subcontractor shall name WestEd as additional insured. Subcontractor shall provide WestEd with appropriate certificate(s) of insurance and of endorsement, including an updated certificate in the event the certificate originally provided expires during the performance period of the Subagreement. Subcontractor also understands and agrees that WestEd may withhold payment for services for any violations of the insurance provisions of this Subagreement.

9.0 Force Majeure

WestEd will not be liable for any failure to perform as required by this Subagreement, if the failure to perform is caused by circumstances reasonably beyond WestEd's control, such as labor disturbances or labor disputes of any kind; accidents; failure of governmental approval required for full performance; civil disorders, insurrections, or commotions; acts of aggression; acts of God; natural disasters (such as earthquakes, floods, tsunamis, etc.); energy or other conservation measures; explosions; failure of utilities; mechanical breakdowns; material shortages or supply chain disruptions; cyberattacks or other compromise of digital systems; disease, pandemic, or other public health crises; theft, vandalism, acts of terrorism, civil disturbance, Acts of war, geopolitical disturbances; or other such occurrences.

10.0 Termination

- 10.1 Either party may terminate this Subagreement before performance is completed by giving written notice to the other party at least thirty (30) calendar days before the termination date. In the event of termination, Subcontractor shall cease all work on the Subagreement upon receiving written notice of termination. Payment shall be made under the Subagreement for all work performed as of the effective date of termination.
- 10.2 WestEd may immediately terminate this Agreement at any time for cause in the event of any incurable material breach of this Agreement by Subcontractor or in the event Subcontractor (or has filed or has filed against it) any bankruptcy, insolvency, or receivership proceeding.

10.3 In the event that the Awarding Agency terminates Prime Contract, Subcontractor shall immediately cease working and terminate the Subcontract. Upon termination, Subcontractor shall furnish to WestEd all necessary data and final reports, on the work completed or in progress through the date of termination. Thereafter, Subcontractor shall be reimbursed for approved, allowable costs and non-cancelable obligations incurred prior to the date of termination in accordance with applicable laws and the terms of the termination of the Prime Contract.

CONDUCT AND CAPACITY OF PARTIES

11.0 Conflict of Interest

Subcontractor warrants that, to the best of the Subcontractor's knowledge and belief, there are no relevant facts or circumstances which could give rise to an organizational conflict of interest, as defined as, activities or relationships with other persons, organizations, or any other third party which would cause Subcontractor to be unable or potentially unable to render impartial assistance or advice to WestEd, or the Subcontractor's objectivity in performing the work might be otherwise impaired, or resulting in an unfair competitive advantage, or that Subcontractor has disclosed all such relevant information to WestEd. Subcontractor agrees that if an actual or potential organizational conflict of interest is discovered after this Subagreement is executed, Subcontractor will make a full disclosure in writing to WestEd. This disclosure shall include a description of actions which Subcontractor has taken or proposes to take, after consultation with WestEd, to avoid, mitigate, or neutralize the actual or potential conflict. WestEd may terminate this Subagreement, in whole or in part, for convenience if it deems such termination necessary to avoid an organizational conflict of interest. If Subcontractor was aware of a potential organizational conflict of interest prior to the execution of this Subagreement or discovered an actual or potential conflict after award and did not disclose or misrepresented relevant information to WestEd, WestEd may terminate the Subagreement for default, or pursue such other remedies as may be permitted by law or this Subagreement.

12.0 Subcontracts and Assignments

Except as specifically stated herein above, Subcontractor shall not subcontract or assign any part of the services to be performed under this Subagreement without the prior written consent and approval of WestEd.

13.0 Disputes

The parties will attempt to settle any dispute, claim or controversy arising out of or relating to this Subagreement or the breach, termination, enforcement, interpretation, or validity thereof, including the determination of the scope (hereinafter a "Dispute"), through good faith negotiations. Such negotiations shall take place face to face, between representatives authorized to settle the Dispute, within thirty (30) days from the date one party provides the other party with written notice of a Dispute and the legal and factual basis for such Dispute (hereinafter the "Negotiations"). Only in the event that a Dispute cannot be resolved through such good faith Negotiations, either party may submit the Dispute to arbitration in San Francisco, California. The arbitration shall be administered by JAMS pursuant to its Comprehensive Arbitration Rules and Procedures. No party shall file an arbitration demand or complaint until the parties have engaged in good faith Negotiations and such Negotiations have ended in an impasse. Judgment on the award rendered by the arbitrators may be entered in any court having jurisdiction. This clause shall not

preclude parties from seeking provisional remedies in aid of arbitration from a court of appropriate jurisdiction.

14.0 Non-Discrimination in Employment

No person shall on the ground of race, religion, citizenship, color, disabilities, national origin, sex, age, political affiliation, service in the uniformed services, genetic information or genetic characteristics, ancestry, marital status, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, medical condition, or beliefs be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity funded or otherwise financially assisted, in whole or in part with funds made available hereunder.

OTHER CONTRACTUAL PROVISIONS

15.0 No Alteration of Subagreement

No alteration, addendum, modification, or waiver of the terms of this Subagreement shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by both parties, and no oral understanding or agreement not incorporated herein shall be binding on either of the parties. No inline delineation or alteration shall be accepted or bind WestEd.

16.0 Authority to Sign

Both parties executing this Subagreement acknowledge and warrant that they possess the authority to enter into this Subagreement on behalf of their respective companies.

17.0 Jurisdiction, Venue, and Governing Law

The parties agree that any legal proceedings arising out the performance of this Subagreement shall be filed in the County of San Francisco, State of California. This Subagreement shall be governed by the substantive laws of California. Subcontractor shall also comply with all applicable federal and state laws, regulations, standards, orders, and requirements.

18.0 Entire Agreement

This Subagreement, together with Exhibits hereto, and any agreements or documents expressly incorporated by reference, is the entire agreement of the parties and supersedes any prior agreements between them, whether written or oral, with respect to the subject matter hereof.

19.0 Severability

If any provision of this Subagreement is found by a court to be void, invalid, or unenforceable, this Subagreement will either be reformed to comply with applicable law or the provision in question will be stricken so as not to affect the validity or enforceability of the remainder of this Subagreement.

20.0 Counterparts

This Subagreement may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which together shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. In the event that any signature is delivered by facsimile transmission or by email delivery of a ".pdf" format data file, such signature shall create a valid and binding obligation of the party executing (or on whose behalf such signature is executed) with the same force and effect as if such facsimile or ".pdf" signature page were an original thereof.

21.0 Notices

Any notice or other communication given by one party to the other under this Subagreement shall be in writing, and will be considered to have been given if delivered by hand or sent by certified United States mail, return receipt requested, or by commercial courier service to the other party at the address stated above or to such other address as may be specified by either party in a notice to the other. Notice is effective upon receipt. Service of legal process by one party on the other relating to a Dispute or an IP Dispute may be accomplished under the provisions of this Section and shall have the same force and effect as if personally served on that party. A copy of any notice or other communication shall also be sent to the Parties' respective email addresses, but such email copy shall not affect the calculation of the effective date of notice.

22.0 Records Maintenance, Retention, and Access

Subcontractor shall maintain proper accounting records and supporting documents that reflect all expenditures related to its performance of services under this Subagreement. WestEd may inspect, audit, or engage at its own expense an outside audit firm to review Subcontractor's books to verify the claimed cost. Subcontractor shall retain all of such records and documents for at least seven (7) years after the final payment under this Subagreement.

23.0 Audit

During the term of this Subagreement and for a reasonable period of time thereafter, WestEd or its agent shall have the right, at periodic intervals and during regular business hours, on Subcontractor's premises, to examine and make copies of all books and records of Subcontractor insofar as they relate to this Subagreement.

24.0 Allowable Costs

Allowable costs are determined in accordance with the cost principles applicable to the organization incurring the costs, e.g., FAR Subpart 31.2 (commercial organizations), 2 CFR 230 (non-profit organizations), 2 CFR 220 (educational institutions). Specific unallowable costs include, but are not limited to, capitalized equipment with an acquisition cost of \$5,000 or more, foreign travel, entertainment cost, and use of funds to influence legislation or appropriations.

25.0 Certification of Cost and Price

Subcontractor hereby certifies that the fees and expenses charged for the work being conducted for WestEd is the Subcontractor's usual and customary fee. Subcontractor also certifies that Subcontractor is not charging other organizations a lower amount for the same work.

26.0 Order of Precedence

Any inconsistency or ambiguity in this Subagreement shall be resolved by giving precedence in the following order: (1) state or federal contract requirements attached hereto and incorporated by reference; (2) the general terms of conditions of this Subagreement, including any edits and addendum; (3) any other attachments and exhibits. WestEd's decision to choose "accept" or an equivalent option associated with a "click-through" agreement does not constitute its concurrence or acceptance of terms, if such terms are in conflict with this section.

A-C. Salaries and Wages; Fringe Benefits

Employee salaries and benefits are based upon a calendar-year salary schedule as agreed upon by the Oakland Unified School District and the United Administrators of Oakland Schools (UAOS). Salaries include the actual days worked for each employee and earned leave, e.g., holidays, vacations, sick leave, etc. Salary rates are current actual rates. Benefits include worker's compensation, unemployment tax, retirement, medical/dental, life insurance, disability insurance, and other staff benefits.

Hourly wages for teachers (*Other Personnel*) are based on an agreement between the Oakland Unified School District and the Oakland Education Association (OEA.) Extended contract work outside teachers' regular work hours is to be compensated at a rate of \$38.50 per hour, plus benefits. Actual benefits vary between individuals based on selected health insurance plans, numbers of dependents, etc., but are estimated at 30% of the hourly extended contract rate.

Sam Berg will serve as co-project director for the external evaluation, at 20% FTE, which is equivalent to 2.0 months or 45 days. Brenda Tuohy will serve as co-project director on this project, at 20% FTE, which is equivalent to 2.0 months or 45 days. She will be responsible for the ongoing Professional Learning Community of teachers participating in this project, including planning and facilitating ongoing meetings and professional development sessions, as well as providing follow-up and coaching support for individual participants.

In Year 1, a team of seven OUSD educators--3 with expertise in middle school computer science, 3 with expertise in middle school mathematics, and 1 with expertise in English Language Development--will be selected as the first design team of teachers in this project. They will meet for a week-long intensive design institute in the Summer of 2025 to develop a lesson-by-lesson guide for incorporating language supports into *Unit 3: Interactive Animations and Games* from the *Code.org CS Discoveries* curriculum, as well as follow-up meetings in the beginning of the first semester of the 2025-2026 to refine the instructional materials.

In the Fall of Year 1, all 12 middle school computer science teachers will have a full release day of professional development to understand and be ready to implement the language support lesson guide that was created by the summer design team. In addition they will join a five week professional learning community (PLC) that will meet on zoom. This PLC will focus on the implementation of the lesson guide. Each week teachers will review the previous week's lessons focusing on student work. The learnings from this discussion will be applied when they look at the upcoming lessons for the next week. During this time six teachers will be filming the implementation of these lessons. These recordings will be used for research purposes as well as to be used in future professional development.

In Year 2, the seven-person design team will reconvene for another week-long intensive institute. The focus of this institute will be to revise the lesson guide based on the feedback and learnings from year one.

In the Fall of Year 2, all twelve OUSD middle school teachers will again convene for a full day of professional development, this time focused on the revised lesson guide. This will be followed by another series of PLC meetings, which will follow the same format as in year one. During year two, three focal teachers will record their lessons for the duration of the unit on Algorithms and Programming, for both research and professional development purposes.

In Year 3, we are allocating additional funding to support final data collection of artifacts for research or use in workshops as we begin dissemination of our learning. We'll prioritize the three focal teachers from Year 2, and use the time flexibly for additional video-recording or collection of student artifacts.

E. Travel

Per diem and mileage is charged at Oakland Unified School District's approved reimbursement rates. Airfare estimates are based on current average round-trip coach fares. Lodging is based on average rates for various cities. For each trip, other expenses include ground transportation (including shuttles, taxis, or trains), parking, tolls, and incidentals.
